askance	With an attitude or look of suspicion or disapproval. <i>A waiter looked askance at his jeans.</i>
behold	See or observe (someone or something, especially of remarkable or impressive nature). <i>Behold Christ.</i>
blink	Try to control or prevent tears by blinking. <i>The government blinked only after losing 46 of the first 48 hearings.</i>
browse	Reading superficially or at random. <i>This book is a useful browse for a new worker in the field.</i>
deer	A hooved grazing or browsing animal, with branched bony antlers that are shed annually and typically borne only by the male.
eyelid	Each of the upper and lower folds of skin which cover the eye when closed.
gaze	Look steadily and intently, especially in admiration, surprise, or thought. <i>He turned following her gaze.</i>
leer	A suggestive or sneering look or grin. <i>He gave me a sly leer.</i>
look	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>She looked her devotion to me.</i>
macroscopic	Relating to large-scale or general analysis.
observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
ocular	Of or relating to or resembling the eye. <i>Ocular muscles.</i>
optic	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>The optic or optical axis of the eye.</i>
optical	(of a device) requiring electromagnetic radiation for its operation. <i>An optical illusion.</i>

perceptual	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. <i>A patient with perceptual problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
searching	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. <i>Searching insights.</i>
see	See and understand have a good eye. <i>I ll probably see you at the meeting.</i>
sensory	Of a nerve fiber or impulse originating outside and passing toward the central nervous system. <i>The sensory cortex.</i>
sidelong	With the side toward someone or something- Nathaniel Hawthorne. <i>Shot out sidelong boughs.</i>
sight	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>Tell me when you sight London Bridge.</i>
sneer	A facial expression of contempt or scorn; the upper lip curls. <i>She sneered her contempt.</i>
spectacle	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The tragic spectacle of cripples trying to escape.</i>
squint	Be cross eyed have a squint or strabismus. <i>The squint bottom edge of the puzzle.</i>
stare	Fixate one's eyes. <i>She tried hard not to stare.</i>
telescopic	Relating to or made with a telescope. <i>There are interesting telescopic objects in Bo tes.</i>
visible	Visible imports or exports. <i>Visible files.</i>
vision	The images seen on a television screen. <i>A utopian vision of society.</i>
visual	Visible- Shakespeare. <i>A visual presentation.</i>
watch	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>The woman with a piercing shriek called the watch.</i>
wink	An act of winking. <i>Barney gave him a knowing wink.</i>
