<u>persevering</u>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>She has been a remarkably steadfast and persevering woman.</i>
persistent	Continuing to exist or occur over a prolonged period. <i>PCBs are persistent environmental contaminants.</i>
pertinacious	Holding firmly to an opinion or a course of action. <i>He worked with a pertinacious resistance to interruptions.</i>
purposeful	Having meaning through having an aim. <i>The purposeful stride of a great barrister.</i>
<u>relentless</u>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>Relentless persecution.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Stood resolute against the enemy.</i>
resolved	Firmly determined to do something. <i>Constance was resolved not to cry.</i>
single-minded	Determined.
<u>staunch</u>	(of a wall) of strong or firm construction. <i>A staunch defender of free speech.</i>
steadfast	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>A steadfast ally.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Regular, even, and continuous in development, frequency, or intensity. <i>The lighter the camera the harder it is to hold steady.</i>
strong-willed	Having a determined will.
tenacious	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. <i>A mind not gifted to discover truth but tenacious to hold it.</i>
<u>tireless</u>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>A tireless worker.</i>

unbending	Reserved, formal, or strict in one's behaviour or attitudes; austere and inflexible. <i>His output is prodigious and springs from the unbending control he exercises over every aspect of his life.</i>
undeviating	Showing no deviation; constant and steady. <i>The undeviating loyalty of his wife.</i>
<u>unfailing</u>	Without error or fault. <i>Unfailing loyalty.</i>
<u>unfaltering</u>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Her unfaltering energy and determination.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>Unflagging courtesy.</i>
<u>unshakeable</u>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>An unshakeable alibi.</i>
untiring	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>His untiring efforts in commissioning ecological reports.</i>
<u>unwavering</u>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i>Unwavering loyalty.</i>
unyielding	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>His unyielding faith.</i>

incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
<u>insistent</u>	Repetitive and persistent. <i>Tony s soft insistent questioning.</i>
intransigence	The trait of being intransigent; stubbornly refusing to compromise. <i>In the face of government intransigence he resigned in disgust.</i>
intransigent	An intransigent person. <i>An intransigent conservative opposed to every liberal tendency.</i>
obduracy	Resoluteness by virtue of being unyielding and inflexible.
obdurate	Stubbornly refusing to change one's opinion or course of action. <i>The child s misery would move even the most obdurate heart.</i>
obstinate	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>Her obstinate determination to pursue a career in radio.</i>
opinionated	Obstinate in your opinions. <i>An arrogant and opinionated man.</i>
<u>ornery</u>	Bad-tempered or difficult to deal with. <i>An ornery old military man.</i>
persistence	The property of a continuous and connected period of time. <i>Cardiff s persistence was rewarded with a try.</i>
persistent	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
pertinacious	Holding firmly to an opinion or a course of action. <i>The most vocal and pertinacious of all the critics.</i>
pigheaded	Obstinate and stupid.
recalcitrance	The trait of being unmanageable.
<u>relentless</u>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>Relentless persecution.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>Faced with a resolute opposition.</i>
steadfast	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i>Steadfast resolve.</i>
stubborn	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>The removal of stubborn screws.</i>
stubbornly	In a way that is difficult to move, remove, or improve. <i>The door stubbornly refused to open.</i>
