<b>obdurate</b>	Stubbornly persistent in wrongdoing. <i>I argued this point with him but he was <b>obdurate</b>.</i>
<b><u>persevering</u></b>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>She has been a remarkably steadfast and <b>persevering</b> woman.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continuing to exist or occur over a prolonged period. <i>PCBs are <b>persistent</b> environmental contaminants.</i>
<b>pertinacious</b>	Holding firmly to an opinion or a course of action. <i>He worked with a <b>pertinacious</b> resistance to interruptions.</i>
<b>purposeful</b>	Having meaning through having an aim. <i>The <b>purposeful</b> stride of a great barrister.</i>
<b><u>relentless</u></b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i><b>Relentless</b> persecution.</i>
<b><u>resolute</u></b>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Stood <b>resolute</b> against the enemy.</i>
<b>resolved</b>	Firmly determined to do something. <i>Constance was <b>resolved</b> not to cry.</i>
<b>single-minded</b>	Determined.
<b><u>staunch</u></b>	(of a wall) of strong or firm construction. <i>A <b>staunch</b> defender of free speech.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>A <b>steadfast</b> ally.</i>
<b><u>steady</u></b>	Regular, even, and continuous in development, frequency, or intensity. <i>The lighter the camera the harder it is to hold <b>steady</b>.</i>
<b>strong-willed</b>	Having a determined will.
<b>tenacious</b>	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. <i>A mind not gifted to discover truth but <b>tenacious</b> to hold it.</i>
<b><u>tireless</u></b>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>A <b>tireless</b> worker.</i>

<b>unbending</b>	Reserved, formal, or strict in one's behaviour or attitudes; austere and inflexible. <i>His output is prodigious and springs from the <b>unbending</b> control he exercises over every aspect of his life.</i>
<b>undeviating</b>	Showing no deviation; constant and steady. <i>The <b>undeviating</b> loyalty of his wife.</i>
<b><u>unfailing</u></b>	Without error or fault. <i><b>Unfailing</b> loyalty.</i>
<b><u>unfaltering</u></b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Her <b>unfaltering</b> energy and determination.</i>

<b>intransigent</b>	An intransigent person. <i>An <b>intransigent</b> conservative opposed to every liberal tendency.</i>
<b>obduracy</b>	Resoluteness by virtue of being unyielding and inflexible.
<b>obdurate</b>	Stubbornly refusing to change one's opinion or course of action. <i>The child s misery would move even the most <b>obdurate</b> heart.</i>
<b>obstinate</b>	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>Her <b>obstinate</b> determination to pursue a career in radio.</i>
<b>opinionated</b>	Obstinate in your opinions. <i>An arrogant and <b>opinionated</b> man.</i>
<b><u>ornery</u></b>	Bad-tempered or difficult to deal with. <i>An <b>ornery</b> old military man.</i>
<b>persistence</b>	The property of a continuous and connected period of time. <i>Cardiff s <b>persistence</b> was rewarded with a try.</i>
