- chick** A young woman.
*The cattle egrets hatched and reared two **chicks**.*
- dame** A woman of refinement.
*A matronly **dame** presided at the table.*
- dolly** An attractive but unintelligent young woman.
*He fumbled a **dolly** at slip.*

english rose	The spin given to a ball by striking it on one side or releasing it with a sharp twist.
figure	A well-known or notable person. <i>Williams became something of a cult figure.</i>
figurine	A small carved or molded figure.
goddess	A female deity. <i>He had an affair with a screen goddess.</i>
marionette	A puppet worked by strings. <i>The bird bobs up and down like a marionette.</i>
model	A hypothetical description of a complex entity or process. <i>A statistical model used for predicting the survival rates of endangered species.</i>
picture	A clear and telling mental image. <i>She had her picture painted.</i>
puppet	A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer. <i>A puppet show.</i>
skirt	Cloth covering that forms the part of a garment below the waist. <i>Bits of beef skirt.</i>
venus	Goddess of love; counterpart of Greek Aphrodite.
vision	The images seen on a television screen. <i>She had defective vision.</i>

dress attractively Decorate (food), as with parsley or other ornamental foods.

dress smartly Kill and prepare for market or consumption.

dress up Give a neat appearance to.

child	An immature childish person. <i>She d been playing tennis since she was a child.</i>
clipper	Scissors for cutting hair or finger nails (often used in the plural). <i>A set of hair clippers.</i>
cute	Sexually attractive; good-looking. <i>A cute kid with pigtails.</i>
dame	A woman of refinement. <i>A rich dame who took her husband to the cleaners.</i>
dancer	A person who dances or whose profession is dancing. <i>She thought he would become a ballet dancer.</i>
debutante	An upper-class young woman making her first appearance in fashionable society. <i>The women s team includes eighteen year old debutante Katharine Merry.</i>

dolly	An attractive but unintelligent young woman. <i>A dolly shot.</i>
entertainer	A person, such as a singer, dancer, or comedian, whose job is to entertain others. <i>She is one of Hollywood's highest paid entertainers.</i>
female	A female animal or plant. <i>A female name.</i>
finger	Touch or feel with the fingers. <i>He was fingered by a supergrass and charged with murder.</i>
handed	Having or involving the use of hands. <i>A four handed card game.</i>
hypnotist	A person who induces hypnosis. <i>A stage hypnotist.</i>
kachina	A small carved figure representing a kachina.
lady	A woman of the peerage in Britain. <i>A chauffeur opened the door of the limousine for the grand lady.</i>
ma'am	A woman of refinement.
mannequin	A person employed by a designer or shop to model clothes. <i>She was too fat to be a mannequin.</i>
milkmaid	A girl or woman who milks cows or does other work in a dairy.
ogle	Stare at in a lecherous manner. <i>A vaguely erotic ogle.</i>
philander	Have amorous affairs; of men. <i>Married men who philander.</i>
playroom	A room in a house that is set aside for children to play in.
plaything	An artifact designed to be played with. <i>She was the mistress and plaything of a wealthy businessman.</i>
puppet	A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer. <i>A former revolutionary hero who is now a puppet of the state.</i>
sir	A title used before the name of knight or baronet. <i>Excuse me sir.</i>
tapping	The action of striking against something with a quick light blow or blows, or a sound made in this way. <i>There was a tapping at the door.</i>
thimble	As much as a thimble will hold.
toe	Hit a golf ball with the toe of the club. <i>She toes inwards.</i>

toy An object, especially a gadget or machine, regarded as providing amusement for an adult.

*I was **toying** with the idea of writing a book.*

ventriloquist A performer who projects the voice into a wooden dummy.

woman A disrespectful form of address to a woman.

*I have a **woman** who comes in four hours a day while I write.*
