<a href="#"><u>maid</u></a>	A female domestic. <i>Mary eventually managed to find a job as a <b>maid</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>menial</u></a>	A person with a menial job.
<a href="#"><u>servant</u></a>	A devoted and helpful follower or supporter. <i>He was a great <b>servant</b> of the Labour Party.</i>

- *Of concern to or concerning the internal affairs of a nation.*
- *Of or for use in the home rather than in an industrial or office environment.*
- *Of or relating to the home.*
- *(of a person) fond of family life and running a home.*
- *Relating to the running of a home or to family relations.*
- *Existing or occurring inside a particular country; not foreign or international.*

- *(of an animal) tame and kept by humans.*
- *Produced in a particular country.*
- *Converted or adapted to domestic use.*
- *Of or involving the home or family.*

<b>interior</b>	Inside and toward a center. <b>Interior</b> decoration.
<b><u>internal</u></b>	Of or situated on the inside. <b>Internal</b> party maneuvering.
<b><u>local</u></b>	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <b>Local</b> anesthesia.
<b><u>national</u></b>	Of or relating to nationality. A <b>national</b> newspaper.
<b><u>native</u></b>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e g native bee. My <b>native</b> land.
<b>not foreign</b>	Not belonging to that in which it is contained; introduced from an outside source.
<b>not international</b>	From or between other countries.
<b>not wild</b>	Talking or behaving irrationally.
<b>pet</b>	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality.
<b><u>private</u></b>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <b>Private</b> family matters.
<b>stay-at-home</b>	Used of your own ground.
<b>tame</b>	Not exciting, adventurous, or controversial. A <b>tame</b> Christmas party.
<b>trained</b>	Shaped or conditioned or disciplined by training; often used as a combining form. <b>Trained</b> volunteers provide a sympathetic ear and friendly advice.

<b>ergonomic</b>	Of or relating to ergonomics. <i>The <b>ergonomic</b> hazards of computer use.</i>
<b>family</b>	(biology) a taxonomic group containing one or more genera. <i>The <b>family</b> home.</i>
<b>habitable</b>	Fit for habitation. <i>The <b>habitable</b> world.</i>
<b>habitation</b>	A house or home. <i>He built his <b>habitation</b> close to the river.</i>
<b>home</b>	At or to or in the direction of one's home or family. <i>A <b>home</b> win.</i>
<b>household</b>	The establishment and affairs of a royal household. <i>It was a good Christian <b>household</b>.</i>
<b>lightweight</b>	A lightweight boxer or other competitor. <i>A <b>lightweight</b> intellect.</i>
<b>local</b>	A local train or bus service. <i>A pint in the <b>local</b>.</i>
<b>locality</b>	The position or site of something. <i>It is a rugged <b>locality</b>.</i>
<b>manor</b>	The landed estate of a lord (including the house on it). <i>The right to mine ores within the <b>manor</b> of Little Langdale.</i>
<b>metropolitan</b>	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A sophisticated <b>metropolitan</b>.</i>

<b><u>national</u></b>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>Plans for a <b>national</b> art library.</i>
<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	People living near one another. <i>He always blames someone else in the immediate <b>neighborhood</b>.</i>
<b>portable</b>	A small transportable building used as a classroom. <i><b>Portable</b> versions of IBM s Systems Network Architecture technology.</i>
<b><u>reside</u></b>	Be situated. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly <b>reside</b> in the semantic meaning.</i>
<b>resident</b>	A medical graduate engaged in specialized practice under supervision in a hospital. <i><b>Resident</b> mute swans and wintering Bewick s swans.</i>
<b><u>sheltered</u></b>	Protected from danger or bad weather. <i>The plants need a shady <b>sheltered</b> spot in the garden.</i>
