Synonyms of "Dominating" as an adjective (9 Words)

ascendant	Tending or directed upward. <i>Rooted and ascendant strength like that of foliage.</i>
ascendent	Tending or directed upward.
autocratic	Offensively self-assured or given to exercising usually unwarranted power. <i>Autocratic behavior.</i>
<u>bossy</u>	Fond of giving people orders; domineering. <i>A bossy way of ordering others around.</i>
<u>commanding</u>	Used of a height or viewpoint. <i>A commanding officer.</i>
high-and-mighty	Having or showing great strength or force or intensity- Bulwer-Lytton.
magisterial	Of or relating to a magistrate. <i>A magisterial pronouncement.</i>
overlooking	Used of a height or viewpoint. <i>The balcony overlooking the ballroom.</i>
peremptory	Not open to appeal or challenge; final. <i>A peremptory order of the court.</i>

- *Looked up at the castle dominating the countryside.*

autocracy	A political system governed by a single individual. <i>The Grand Duchy of Tuscany was an autocracy.</i>
autocrat	An imperious person who insists on complete obedience from others. <i>Eva was an autocrat people didn't argue unless they had a lot of courage.</i>
autocratic	Taking no account of other people's wishes or opinions; domineering. <i>Autocratic government.</i>
controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully controllable.</i>
despot	A cruel and oppressive dictator.
despotism	The exercise of absolute power, especially in a cruel and oppressive way. <i>Some nations are democracies others are despotisms.</i>
dictator	A person who behaves in an autocratic way. <i>My boss is a dictator who makes everyone work overtime.</i>
dictatorship	Absolute authority in any sphere. <i>The effects of forty years of dictatorship.</i>
fascism	(in general use) extreme authoritarian, oppressive, or intolerant views or practices. <i>This is yet another example of health fascism in action.</i>
fascist	Relating to fascism. <i>If I were being a culinary fascist I would possibly moan about the overdone cooked tomatoes.</i>
governor	A member of a governing body. <i>The governor of the Bank of England.</i>
indiscriminately	In a random manner; unsystematically. <i>People who are sedentary and who eat indiscriminately.</i>
king	Used in names of animals and plants that are particularly large e.g king cobra. <i>The king of rock.</i>
manageable	Capable of being managed or controlled. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and manageable.</i>
monocracy	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc.)

<u>monopolize</u>	Have or take the greatest share of. <i>The bigger clubs monopolize the most profitable sponsorships and TV deals.</i>
<u>oppression</u>	Mental pressure or distress. <i>After years of oppression they finally revolted.</i>
potentate	A monarch or ruler, especially an autocratic one.
proletarian	A member of the working class (not necessarily employed). <i>They are true proletarians.</i>
<u>regime</u>	A coordinated programme for the promotion or restoration of health a regimen. <i>Ideological opponents of the regime.</i>
reign	Have sovereign power. <i>Queen Elizabeth reigns over the UK.</i>
<u>ruler</u>	A straight strip or cylinder of plastic, wood, metal, or other rigid material, typically marked at regular intervals and used to draw straight lines or measure distances.
satrap	A governor of a province in ancient Persia.
<u>suppress</u>	Bring under control by force or authority. <i>Suppress a nascent uprising.</i>
<u>theocracy</u>	A system of government in which priests rule in the name of God or a god. <i>It is a society just emerging from theocracy.</i>
totalitarianism	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against totalitarianism.</i>
tyrannize	Rule or exercise power over (somebody) in a cruel and autocratic manner. <i>He tyrannizes over the servants.</i>
<u>tyranny</u>	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc). <i>Refugees fleeing tyranny and oppression.</i>
<u>tyrant</u>	A tyrant flycatcher. <i>Her father was a tyrant and a bully.</i>
