ascendancy	Occupation of a position of dominant power or influence. <i>The poor have a moral ascendancy over the rich.</i>
authority	The confidence resulting from personal expertise. <i>He was an authority on the stock market.</i>
<u>colony</u>	A group of people living in a colony consisting of the original settlers and their descendants and successors. <i>An artists colony.</i>
command	The power or authority to command. <i>He obeyed her commands without question.</i>
control	The economic policy of controlling or limiting or curbing prices or wages etc. <i>He lost control of his car.</i>
<u>dependency</u>	A country or province controlled by another. <i>The country s dependency on the oil industry.</i>

direction	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>They proposed a new direction for the firm.</i>
district	A division of a county or region that elects its own councillors. <i>An elegant shopping district.</i>
dominance	The predominance of one or more species in a plant or animal community. <i>Her apparent dominance of her husband was really her attempt to make him pay attention to her.</i>
government	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>A democratic form of government.</i>
hegemony	The dominance or leadership of one social group or nation over others. <i>The hegemony of a single member state is not incompatible with a genuine confederation.</i>
jurisdiction	(law) the right and power to interpret and apply the law. <i>The claim will be within the jurisdiction of the industrial tribunal.</i>
lordship	Supreme power or rule. <i>Lands including the lordship of Denbigh.</i>
mastery	Power to dominate or defeat. <i>A child s mastery of language.</i>
outpost	A military post stationed at a distance from the main body of troops. <i>A few scattered outposts along the west coast.</i>
overlordship	The position of overlord.
power	A state powerful enough to influence events throughout the world. <i>The power of the president.</i>
predominance	The possession or exertion of control or power. <i>Hollywood s continued predominance in the international film market.</i>
primacy	The fact of an item having been presented earlier to the subject (especially as increasing its likelihood of being remembered). <i>London s primacy as a financial centre.</i>
protectorate	The relationship between a protectorate and the state that controls it. <i>Panama was juridically a protectorate of the United States.</i>
province	A district under an archbishop or a metropolitan. <i>Chengdu capital of Sichuan province.</i>

rule	A strip of wood or other rigid material used for measuring length or marking straight lines a ruler. <i>The right hand rule for inductive fields.</i>
satellite	Transmitted by satellite using or relating to satellite technology. <i>Satellite broadcasting.</i>
satellite state	A person who follows or serves another.
sovereignty	A self-governing state. <i>National sovereignty.</i>
<u>superiority</u>	A supercilious manner or attitude. <i>The allies have achieved air superiority.</i>
<u>supremacy</u>	Power to dominate or defeat. <i>The supremacy of the king.</i>
suzerainty	A position of control by a sovereign or state over another state that is internally autonomous. <i>Henry claimed suzerainty over the duchy of Brittany.</i>
<u>sway</u>	Rule; control. <i>The easy sway of her hips.</i>
territorial dominion	A territorial military unit.
<u>territory</u>	An area of land under the jurisdiction of a ruler or state. <i>Sorties into enemy territory.</i>
