Associations of "Domino effect" (30 Words)

affect	Act physically on; have an effect upon. <i>Your attitude will affect how successful you are.</i>
<u>analgesic</u>	An analgesic drug. <i>An analgesic effect.</i>
consequence	Importance or relevance. <i>A woman of consequence.</i>
<u>dramatic</u>	Suitable to or characteristic of drama. <i>A dramatic increase in recorded crime.</i>
efficacy	Capacity or power to produce a desired effect. <i>There is little information on the efficacy of this treatment.</i>
impact	The action of one object coming forcibly into contact with another. <i>Bullets which expand and cause devastating injury on impact.</i>
impinge	Impinge or infringe upon. <i>This impinges on my rights as an individual.</i>
implication	A relation implicated by virtue of involvement or close connection (especially an incriminating involvement). <i>The implication is that no one person at the bank is responsible.</i>
<u>impression</u>	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>His impression of her was favorable.</i>
incommensurate	Not corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Man s influence on the earth s surface seems incommensurate with his scale.</i>
influence	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>Used her parents influence to get the job.</i>
<u>influential</u>	An influential person. <i>Her work is influential in feminist psychology.</i>

irritant	A substance that causes slight inflammation or other discomfort to the body. <i>In 1966 Vietnam was becoming an irritant to the government.</i>
jolt	A sudden jarring impact. <i>The audience was jolted by the play.</i>
leverage	Supplement with leverage. <i>My spade hit something solid that wouldn't respond to leverage.</i>
medicinal	A medicinal substance. <i>Medicinal properties.</i>
militate	Have force or influence; bring about an effect or change. <i>These fundamental differences will militate against the two communities coming together.</i>
moderating	Lessening in intensity or strength.
painkiller	A medicine used to relieve pain.
placebo	A measure designed merely to humour or placate someone. <i>Pacified by the placebos of the previous year they claimed a moral victory.</i>
potentiate	Increase the power, effect, or likelihood of (something, especially a drug or physiological reaction). <i>Potentiate the drug.</i>
prescription	Available only with a doctor's written prescription. <i>The lotion is available on prescription.</i>
ramification	The action of ramifying or the state of being ramified. <i>A coronary angiogram showed ramification of the right coronary artery close to the ostium.</i>
repercussion	A remote or indirect consequence of some action. <i>His declaration had unforeseen repercussions.</i>
result	Have as a result or residue. <i>Exam results.</i>
startle	To stimulate to action. <i>The loud noise startled him awake.</i>
synergy	The working together of two things (muscles or drugs for example) to produce an effect greater than the sum of their individual effects. <i>The synergy between artist and record company.</i>
systemic	Relating to a system, especially as opposed to a particular part. <i>A systemic poison.</i>

vehement

Showing strong feeling; forceful, passionate, or intense.
Vehement criticism.

vigor

Forceful exertion.
