## Associations of "Domino effect" (30 Words)

<b>affect</b>	Act physically on; have an effect upon. <i>Your attitude will <b>affect</b> how successful you are.</i>
<a href="#"><u>analgesic</u></a>	An analgesic drug. <i>An <b>analgesic</b> effect.</i>
<b>consequence</b>	Importance or relevance. <i>A woman of <b>consequence</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>dramatic</u></a>	Suitable to or characteristic of drama. <i>A <b>dramatic</b> increase in recorded crime.</i>
<b>efficacy</b>	Capacity or power to produce a desired effect. <i>There is little information on the <b>efficacy</b> of this treatment.</i>
<b>impact</b>	The action of one object coming forcibly into contact with another. <i>Bullets which expand and cause devastating injury on <b>impact</b>.</i>
<b>impinge</b>	Impinge or infringe upon. <i>This <b>impinges</b> on my rights as an individual.</i>
<b>implication</b>	A relation implicated by virtue of involvement or close connection (especially an incriminating involvement). <i>The <b>implication</b> is that no one person at the bank is responsible.</i>
<a href="#"><u>impression</u></a>	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>His <b>impression</b> of her was favorable.</i>
<b>incommensurate</b>	Not corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Man s influence on the earth s surface seems <b>incommensurate</b> with his scale.</i>
<b>influence</b>	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>Used her parents <b>influence</b> to get the job.</i>
<a href="#"><u>influential</u></a>	An influential person. <i>Her work is <b>influential</b> in feminist psychology.</i>

<b>irritant</b>	A substance that causes slight inflammation or other discomfort to the body. <i>In 1966 Vietnam was becoming an <b>irritant</b> to the government.</i>
<b>jolt</b>	A sudden jarring impact. <i>The audience was <b>jolted</b> by the play.</i>
<b>leverage</b>	Supplement with leverage. <i>My spade hit something solid that wouldn't respond to <b>leverage</b>.</i>
<b>medicinal</b>	A medicinal substance. <i><b>Medicinal</b> properties.</i>
<b>militate</b>	Have force or influence; bring about an effect or change. <i>These fundamental differences will <b>militate</b> against the two communities coming together.</i>
<b>moderating</b>	Lessening in intensity or strength.
<b>painkiller</b>	A medicine used to relieve pain.
<b>placebo</b>	A measure designed merely to humour or placate someone. <i>Pacified by the <b>placebos</b> of the previous year they claimed a moral victory.</i>
<b>potentiate</b>	Increase the power, effect, or likelihood of (something, especially a drug or physiological reaction). <i><b>Potentiate</b> the drug.</i>
<b>prescription</b>	Available only with a doctor's written prescription. <i>The lotion is available on <b>prescription</b>.</i>
<b>ramification</b>	The action of ramifying or the state of being ramified. <i>A coronary angiogram showed <b>ramification</b> of the right coronary artery close to the ostium.</i>
<b>repercussion</b>	A remote or indirect consequence of some action. <i>His declaration had unforeseen <b>repercussions</b>.</i>
<b>result</b>	Have as a result or residue. <i>Exam <b>results</b>.</i>
<b>startle</b>	To stimulate to action. <i>The loud noise <b>startled</b> him awake.</i>
<b>synergy</b>	The working together of two things (muscles or drugs for example) to produce an effect greater than the sum of their individual effects. <i>The <b>synergy</b> between artist and record company.</i>
<b>systemic</b>	Relating to a system, especially as opposed to a particular part. <i>A <b>systemic</b> poison.</i>

Showing strong feeling; forceful, passionate, or intense.  
***Vehement*** criticism.

**vigor**

Forceful exertion.
