- dormitory** A large bedroom for a number of people in a school or institution.
A **dormitory** town.
- hall** A large country house, especially one with a landed estate.
Lecture **hall**.
- residence hall** Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily.
- student residence** A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution.



Associations of "Dorm" (30 Words)

absence	An occasion or period of being away from a place or person. <i>He visited during my absence.</i>
academy	A secondary school (usually private). <i>A police academy.</i>
bed	Used with reference to a bed as the typical place for sexual activity. <i>The room had only a bed and chair.</i>
blackboard	Sheet of slate; for writing with chalk.
boarding	The action of getting on or into a ship, aircraft, or other vehicle. <i>Students all had to pay boarding fees.</i>
campus	The grounds and buildings of a university or college. <i>For the first year I had a room on campus.</i>
canteen	Sells food and personal items to personnel at an institution or school or camp etc.
class	Arrange or order by classes or categories. <i>An emerging professional class.</i>
classmate	An acquaintance that you go to school with.
classroom	A room in a school where lessons take place.
college	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>Colleges of further education.</i>
diploma	A document certifying the successful completion of a course of study.
dormitory	A large bedroom for a number of people in a school or institution. <i>He visited the boarders in their dormitory.</i>
frenchman	A person of French nationality.
grad	One-hundredth of a right angle.
graduation	A mark on a container or instrument indicating a degree of quantity. <i>The ruler had 16 graduations per inch.</i>
gymnasium	A school in Germany, Scandinavia, or central Europe that prepares pupils for university entrance.
headmaster	A man who is the head teacher in a school.
homeroom	A classroom in which all students in a particular grade (or in a division of a grade) meet at certain times under the supervision of a teacher who takes attendance and does other administrative business.
motel	A motor hotel.
pedagogics	The principles and methods of instruction.

pedagogy	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>The relationship between applied linguistics and language pedagogy.</i>
playpen	A small portable enclosure in which a baby or small child can play safely.
playroom	A recreation room for noisy activities (parties or children's play etc.
polytechnic	A technical school offering instruction in many industrial arts and applied sciences.
pupil	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i>
schoolmaster	Any person (or institution) who acts as an educator.
teach	A teacher. <i>She teaches at the local high school.</i>
trainee	Someone who is being trained. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i>
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>An undergraduate degree.</i>
