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Associations of "Double check" (30 Words)

audit

Attend (a class) informally, without working for credit.

Audit *accounts and tax returns.*

confirmation

(in the Christian Church) the rite at which a baptized person, especially one baptized as an infant, affirms Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the Church.

*Fossils provided further **confirmation** of the evolutionary theory.*

constable

A police officer of the lowest rank.

director

Member of a board of directors.

*The sales **director**.*

doubled

Twice as great or many.

*The dose is **doubled**.*

dual

In an aircraft using dual controls.

Dual *controls for pilot and copilot.*

examiner

A person whose job is to inspect something; an inspector.

*Exams are marked by external **examiners**.*

flaw

Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective.

*He had his **flaws** but he was still a great teacher.*

foreman

A man who is foreperson of a jury.

*If you want to leave early you have to ask the **foreman**.*

inspect

Examine (someone or something) to ensure that they reach an official standard.

*Please **inspect** your father s will carefully.*

inspector

A police officer ranking below a chief inspector.

*A prison **inspector**.*

keypad

A miniature keyboard or set of buttons for operating a portable electronic device, telephone, or other equipment.

monitor	<p>A person operating a monitor. <i>Radio monitors reported they heard the pilot say he was heading for Paris.</i></p>
oversee	<p>Watch and direct. <i>The Home Secretary oversees the police service.</i></p>
plural	<p>The plural number. <i>A plural society.</i></p>
proctor	<p>An officer (usually one of two) at certain universities, appointed annually and having mainly disciplinary functions. <i>18 of the faculty reported that graduate assistants frequently proctored exams.</i></p>
reconnaissance	<p>The act of reconnoitring (especially to gain information about an enemy or potential enemy). <i>An exchange of fire occurred on a reconnaissance mission.</i></p>
reconnoiter	<p>Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.</p>
scrutinize	<p>Examine carefully for accuracy with the intent of verification. <i>He scrutinized his likeness in the mirror.</i></p>
scrutiny	<p>A prolonged intense look. <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny.</i></p>
substantiation	<p>Additional proof that something that was believed (some fact or hypothesis or theory) is correct.</p>
superintend	<p>Watch and direct. <i>He superintended a land reclamation scheme.</i></p>
superintendence	<p>Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>Under his vigilant superintendence a building was erected.</i></p>
supervise	<p>Observe and direct the execution of (a task or activity). <i>Nurses were supervised by a consultant psychiatrist.</i></p>
supervision	<p>The action of supervising someone or something. <i>She let them work without supervision.</i></p>
supervisory	<p>Having or relating to the role of observing and directing an activity or a person. <i>The women play a largely supervisory role in the process.</i></p>
surveillance	<p>Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i></p>

twofold

Having more than one decidedly dissimilar aspects or qualities-

*Use increased more than **twofold** from 1979 to 1989.*

verification

An affidavit attached to a statement confirming the truth of that
statement.

*The **verification** of official documents.*

watch

The officers and crew on duty during a watch.

*In spring and summer **watch** for kingfishers.*
