Associations of "Double check" (30 Words)

<u>audit</u>	Attend (a class) informally, without working for credit. <i>Audit</i> accounts and tax returns.
confirmation	(in the Christian Church) the rite at which a baptized person, especially one baptized as an infant, affirms Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the Church. <i>Fossils provided further confirmation of the evolutionary theory.</i>
constable	A police officer of the lowest rank.
director	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales director</i> .
doubled	Twice as great or many. <i>The dose is doubled.</i>
<u>dual</u>	In an aircraft using dual controls. <i>Dual</i> controls for pilot and copilot.
examiner	A person whose job is to inspect something; an inspector. Exams are marked by external examiner s.
flaw	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>He had his flaws but he was still a great teacher.</i>
foreman	A man who is foreperson of a jury. If you want to leave early you have to ask the foreman .
inspect	Examine (someone or something) to ensure that they reach an official standard. <i>Please inspect your father s will carefully.</i>
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. A prison inspector .
keypad	A miniature keyboard or set of buttons for operating a portable electronic device, telephone, or other equipment.



monitor	A person operating a monitor. Radio monitor s reported they heard the pilot say he was heading for Paris.
<u>oversee</u>	Watch and direct. The Home Secretary oversee s the police service.
plural	The plural number. A plural society.
proctor	An officer (usually one of two) at certain universities, appointed annually and having mainly disciplinary functions. 18 of the faculty reported that graduate assistants frequently proctor ed exams.
<u>reconnaissance</u>	The act of reconnoitring (especially to gain information about an enemy or potential enemy. <i>An exchange of fire occurred on a reconnaissance mission.</i>
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
<u>scrutinize</u>	Examine carefully for accuracy with the intent of verification. <i>He</i> scrutinize <i>d</i> his likeness in the mirror.
scrutiny	A prolonged intense look. Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny .
substantiation	Additional proof that something that was believed (some fact or hypothesis or theory) is correct.
superintend	Watch and direct. <i>He superintended a land reclamation scheme.</i>
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. Under his vigilant superintendence a building was erected.
<u>supervise</u>	Observe and direct the execution of (a task or activity. Nurses were supervise d by a consultant psychiatrist.
supervision	The action of supervising someone or something. She let them work without supervision .
supervisory	Having or relating to the role of observing and directing an activity or a person. The women play a largely supervisory role in the process.
surveillance	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance</i> by British military intelligence.



twofold	Having more than one decidedly dissimilar aspects or qualities- R.W.Emerson. <i>Use increased more than twofold from 1979 to 1989.</i>
verification	An affidavit attached to a statement confirming the truth of that statement. <i>The verification of official documents.</i>
<u>watch</u>	The officers and crew on duty during a watch. In spring and summer watch for kingfishers.
