Associations of "Double check" (30 Words)

<u>audit</u>	Attend (a class) informally, without working for credit. <i>Audit accounts and tax returns.</i>
confirmation	(in the Christian Church) the rite at which a baptized person, especially one baptized as an infant, affirms Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the Church. <i>Fossils provided further confirmation of the evolutionary theory.</i>
constable	A police officer of the lowest rank.
director	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales director.</i>
doubled	Twice as great or many. <i>The dose is doubled.</i>
<u>dual</u>	In an aircraft using dual controls. <i>Dual controls for pilot and copilot.</i>
examiner	A person whose job is to inspect something; an inspector. <i>Exams are marked by external examiners.</i>
flaw	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>He had his flaws but he was still a great teacher.</i>
foreman	A man who is foreperson of a jury. <i>If you want to leave early you have to ask the foreman.</i>
inspect	Examine (someone or something) to ensure that they reach an official standard. <i>Please inspect your father s will carefully.</i>
inspector	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. <i>A prison inspector.</i>
keypad	A miniature keyboard or set of buttons for operating a portable electronic device, telephone, or other equipment.

monitor	A person operating a monitor. <i>Radio monitors reported they heard the pilot say he was heading for Paris.</i>
<u>oversee</u>	Watch and direct. <i>The Home Secretary oversees the police service.</i>
plural	The plural number. <i>A plural society.</i>
proctor	An officer (usually one of two) at certain universities, appointed annually and having mainly disciplinary functions. <i>18 of the faculty reported that graduate assistants frequently proctored exams.</i>
<u>reconnaissance</u>	The act of reconnoitring (especially to gain information about an enemy or potential enemy). <i>An exchange of fire occurred on a reconnaissance mission.</i>
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
<u>scrutinize</u>	Examine carefully for accuracy with the intent of verification. <i>He scrutinized his likeness in the mirror.</i>
scrutiny	A prolonged intense look. <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny.</i>
substantiation	Additional proof that something that was believed (some fact or hypothesis or theory) is correct.
superintend	Watch and direct. <i>He superintended a land reclamation scheme.</i>
superintendence	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>Under his vigilant superintendence a building was erected.</i>
<u>supervise</u>	Observe and direct the execution of (a task or activity). <i>Nurses were supervised by a consultant psychiatrist.</i>
supervision	The action of supervising someone or something. <i>She let them work without supervision.</i>
supervisory	Having or relating to the role of observing and directing an activity or a person. <i>The women play a largely supervisory role in the process.</i>
surveillance	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i>

twofold	Having more than one decidedly dissimilar aspects or qualities- R.W.Emerson. <i>Use increased more than twofold from 1979 to 1989.</i>
verification	An affidavit attached to a statement confirming the truth of that statement. <i>The verification of official documents.</i>
<u>watch</u>	The officers and crew on duty during a watch. <i>In spring and summer watch for kingfishers.</i>
