## Associations of "Double check" (30 Words)

<b><u>audit</u></b>	Attend (a class) informally, without working for credit. <i><b>Audit</b> accounts and tax returns.</i>
<b>confirmation</b>	(in the Christian Church) the rite at which a baptized person, especially one baptized as an infant, affirms Christian belief and is admitted as a full member of the Church. <i>Fossils provided further <b>confirmation</b> of the evolutionary theory.</i>
<b>constable</b>	A police officer of the lowest rank.
<b>director</b>	Member of a board of directors. <i>The sales <b>director</b>.</i>
<b>doubled</b>	Twice as great or many. <i>The dose is <b>doubled</b>.</i>
<b><u>dual</u></b>	In an aircraft using dual controls. <i><b>Dual</b> controls for pilot and copilot.</i>
<b>examiner</b>	A person whose job is to inspect something; an inspector. <i>Exams are marked by external <b>examiners</b>.</i>
<b>flaw</b>	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>He had his <b>flaws</b> but he was still a great teacher.</i>
<b>foreman</b>	A man who is foreperson of a jury. <i>If you want to leave early you have to ask the <b>foreman</b>.</i>
<b>inspect</b>	Examine (someone or something) to ensure that they reach an official standard. <i>Please <b>inspect</b> your father s will carefully.</i>
<b>inspector</b>	A police officer ranking below a chief inspector. <i>A prison <b>inspector</b>.</i>
<b>keypad</b>	A miniature keyboard or set of buttons for operating a portable electronic device, telephone, or other equipment.

<b>monitor</b>	A person operating a monitor. <i>Radio <b>monitors</b> reported they heard the pilot say he was heading for Paris.</i>
<u><a href="#">oversee</a></u>	Watch and direct. <i>The Home Secretary <b>oversees</b> the police service.</i>
<b>plural</b>	The plural number. <i>A <b>plural</b> society.</i>
<b>proctor</b>	An officer (usually one of two) at certain universities, appointed annually and having mainly disciplinary functions. <i>18 of the faculty reported that graduate assistants frequently <b>proctored</b> exams.</i>
<u><a href="#">reconnaissance</a></u>	The act of reconnoitring (especially to gain information about an enemy or potential enemy). <i>An exchange of fire occurred on a <b>reconnaissance</b> mission.</i>
<b>reconnoiter</b>	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
<u><a href="#">scrutinize</a></u>	Examine carefully for accuracy with the intent of verification. <i>He <b>scrutinized</b> his likeness in the mirror.</i>
<b>scrutiny</b>	A prolonged intense look. <i>Every aspect of local government was placed under <b>scrutiny</b>.</i>
<b>substantiation</b>	Additional proof that something that was believed (some fact or hypothesis or theory) is correct.
<b>superintend</b>	Watch and direct. <i>He <b>superintended</b> a land reclamation scheme.</i>
<b>superintendence</b>	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>Under his vigilant <b>superintendence</b> a building was erected.</i>
<u><a href="#">supervise</a></u>	Observe and direct the execution of (a task or activity). <i>Nurses were <b>supervised</b> by a consultant psychiatrist.</i>
<b>supervision</b>	The action of supervising someone or something. <i>She let them work without <b>supervision</b>.</i>
<b>supervisory</b>	Having or relating to the role of observing and directing an activity or a person. <i>The women play a largely <b>supervisory</b> role in the process.</i>
<b>surveillance</b>	Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under <b>surveillance</b> by British military intelligence.</i>

<b>twofold</b>	Having more than one decidedly dissimilar aspects or qualities- R.W.Emerson. <i>Use increased more than <b>twofold</b> from 1979 to 1989.</i>
<b>verification</b>	An affidavit attached to a statement confirming the truth of that statement. <i>The <b>verification</b> of official documents.</i>
<u><a href="#">watch</a></u>	The officers and crew on duty during a watch. <i>In spring and summer <b>watch</b> for kingfishers.</i>
