flawless Without a flaw.

Her smooth **flawless** skin.

(used as an interjection) an expression of surprise or skepticism or irony

indeed etc.

It is very cold **indeed**.

indubitable Impossible to doubt; unquestionable.

An **indubitable** truth.

indubitably In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. *Indubitably liberalism parades under many quises*.

obvious Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent.

Obvious errors.

obviously In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly.

She was **obviously** unwell.

Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.

I m **sure** I ve seen that dress before.
