## Associations of "Doused" (30 Words)

<a href="#">ablaze</a>	Resembling flame in brilliance or color. <i>His eyes were <b>ablaze</b> with excitement.</i>
<b>afire</b>	Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. <i>Forests set ablaze or <b>afire</b> by lightning.</i>
<b>aflame</b>	Keenly excited (especially sexually) or indicating excitement. <i>He was <b>aflame</b> with desire.</i>
<b>alight</b>	(of a bird) descend from the air and settle. <i>He was the only passenger to <b>alight</b> from the train.</i>
<b>blaze</b>	Indicate by marking trees with blazes. <i>They chipped off bark to mark the trail with <b>blazes</b>.</i>
<b>burn</b>	Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>The iron <b>burnt</b> a hole in my dress.</i>
<a href="#">burning</a>	The act of burning something. <i>A <b>burning</b> building.</i>
<b>combustion</b>	A state of violent disturbance and excitement. <i>A large <b>combustion</b> plant.</i>
<a href="#">conflagration</a>	A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a <b>conflagration</b> in many drought devastated communities.</i>
<b>drench</b>	Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged. <i>I fell in the stream and was <b>drenched</b>.</i>
<b>extinguish</b>	Extinguish by crushing. <i>Firemen were soaking everything to <b>extinguish</b> the blaze.</i>
<b>fiery</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>A <b>fiery</b> temper.</i>

<b>fire</b>	A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. <i>Fire a gun.</i>
<b>firefighter</b>	A person whose job is to extinguish fires.
<b>fireman</b>	A pitcher who does not start the game.
<b><u>flame</u></b>	Shine or glow like a flame. <i>A <b>flame</b> red Alfa Romeo.</i>
<b>flaming</b>	Burning fiercely and emitting flames. <i>You <b>flaming</b> idiot.</i>
<b><u>flare</u></b>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Behind him lightning <b>flared</b>.</i>
<b>furnace</b>	Used to describe a very hot place. <i>Her car was a <b>furnace</b>.</i>
<b>glow</b>	Experience a feeling of well-being or happiness, as from good health or an intense emotion. <i>With a <b>glow</b> of pride Mildred walked away.</i>
<b>halon</b>	A compound in which the hydrogen atoms of a hydrocarbon have been replaced by bromine and other halogen atoms; very stable; used in fire extinguishers although it is thought to release bromine that depletes the ozone layer.
<b>igneous</b>	Produced by the action of fire or intense heat. <i>Rocks formed by <b>igneous</b> agents.</i>
<b>irascible</b>	Having or showing a tendency to be easily angered. <i>An <b>irascible</b> response.</i>
<b>macerate</b>	Cause to waste away by fasting. <i><b>Macerate</b> peaches.</i>
<b>smoulder</b>	Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>The controversy <b>smouldered</b> on for several years.</i>
<b><u>soak</u></b>	Washing something by allowing it to soak. <i>She spent some time <b>soaking</b> in a hot bath.</i>
<b>sodden</b>	Wet through and through; thoroughly wet. <i>The rains have <b>soddened</b> the earth.</i>
<b>sop</b>	Dip into liquid. <i>The dews bemoistening <b>sop</b> his hardened shoes.</i>
<b>stoke</b>	Encourage or incite (a strong emotion or tendency). <i>He <b>stoked</b> up the barbecue.</i>
<b>torrid</b>	Full of difficulty. <i><b>Torrid</b> jazz bands.</i>
