| ablaze | Resembling flame in brilliance or color. <i>His eyes were ablaze with excitement.</i> |
| afire | Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. <i>Forests set ablaze or afire by lightning.</i> |
| aflame | Keenly excited (especially sexually) or indicating excitement. <i>He was aflame with desire.</i> |
| alight | (of a bird) descend from the air and settle. <i>He was the only passenger to alight from the train.</i> |
| blaze | Indicate by marking trees with blazes. <i>They chipped off bark to mark the trail with blazes.</i> |
| burn | Burn sear or freeze tissue using a hot iron or electric current or a caustic agent. <i>The iron burnt a hole in my dress.</i> |
| burning | The act of burning something. <i>A burning building.</i> |
| combustion | A state of violent disturbance and excitement. <i>A large combustion plant.</i> |
| conflagration | A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a conflagration in many drought devastated communities.</i> |
| drench | Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged. <i>I fell in the stream and was drenched.</i> |
| extinguish | Extinguish by crushing. <i>Firemen were soaking everything to extinguish the blaze.</i> |
| fiery | Characterized by intense emotion. <i>A fiery temper.</i> |

| fire | A fireplace in which a relatively small fire is burning. <i>Fire a gun.</i> |
| firefighter | A person whose job is to extinguish fires. |
| fireman | A pitcher who does not start the game. |
| flame | Shine or glow like a flame. <i>A flame red Alfa Romeo.</i> |
| flaming | Burning fiercely and emitting flames. <i>You flaming idiot.</i> |
| flare | Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Behind him lightning flared.</i> |
| furnace | Used to describe a very hot place. <i>Her car was a furnace.</i> |
| glow | Experience a feeling of well-being or happiness, as from good health or an intense emotion. <i>With a glow of pride Mildred walked away.</i> |
| halon | A compound in which the hydrogen atoms of a hydrocarbon have been replaced by bromine and other halogen atoms; very stable; used in fire extinguishers although it is thought to release bromine that depletes the ozone layer. |
| igneous | Produced by the action of fire or intense heat. <i>Rocks formed by igneous agents.</i> |
| irascible | Having or showing a tendency to be easily angered. <i>An irascible response.</i> |
| macerate | Cause to waste away by fasting. <i>Macerate peaches.</i> |
| smoulder | Smoke coming from a smouldering fire. <i>The controversy smouldered on for several years.</i> |
| soak | Washing something by allowing it to soak. <i>She spent some time soaking in a hot bath.</i> |
| sodden | Wet through and through; thoroughly wet. <i>The rains have soddened the earth.</i> |
| sop | Dip into liquid. <i>The dews bemoistening sop his hardened shoes.</i> |
| stoke | Encourage or incite (a strong emotion or tendency). <i>He stoked up the barbecue.</i> |
| torrid | Full of difficulty. <i>Torrid jazz bands.</i> |
