allure	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>Will sponsors really be allured by such opportunities.</i>
anchorage	An anchorite’s dwelling place. <i>The mother provides emotional anchorage for the entire family.</i>
attract	Be attractive to. <i>I am not attracted to him at all.</i>
barge	Transport by barge on a body of water. <i>Just barge the other skater off the ball.</i>
cart	Convey or put in a cart or similar vehicle. <i>Seven demonstrators were carted away by the police.</i>
draw	An act of drawing on a cigarette or cigar. <i>The museum has turned out to be a big draw for school children in the city.</i>
<u>dredge</u>	Clear the bed of a harbour river or other area of water by scooping out mud weeds and rubbish with a dredge. <i>Mud was dredged out of the harbour.</i>
drone	A musical instrument or part of one sounding a continuous note of low pitch in particular also drone pipe a pipe in a bagpipe or also drone string a string in an instrument such as a hurdy gurdy or a sitar. <i>He reached for another beer while Jim droned on.</i>
<u>elicit</u>	Evoke or draw out (a reaction, answer, or fact) from someone. <i>I tried to elicit a smile from Joanna.</i>
embroil	Involve (someone) deeply in an argument, conflict, or difficult situation. <i>What merit do you claim for having embroiled everything in which you are concerned.</i>
engaging	Attracting or delighting. <i>An engaging smile.</i>
<u>entice</u>	Attract or tempt by offering pleasure or advantage. <i>The treat is offered to entice the dog to eat.</i>

gravitational	Denoting a forceful attraction or movement towards something. <i>The gravitational field of the comet is very weak.</i>
haul	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>Included in her beauty haul were a lot of facial masks.</i>
haulage	A charge for the commercial transport of goods. <i>Road haulage.</i>
ingratiating	Calculated to please or gain favor. <i>A smooth ingratiating manner.</i>
intrigue	Form intrigues for in an underhand manner. <i>I was intrigued by your question.</i>
inviting	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
lug	A sail with four corners that is hoisted from a yard that is oblique to the mast. <i>She began to lug her suitcase down the stairs.</i>
lure	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The lure of the exotic East.</i>
magnet	Physics a device that attracts iron and produces a magnetic field. <i>The beautiful stretch of white sand is a magnet for sun worshippers.</i>
pull	A handle to hold while pulling. <i>The magazine pulled its trick of producing the right issue at the right time.</i>
straighten	Straighten by unrolling. <i>They are asking for help in straightening out their lives.</i>
tempt	Try to seduce. <i>He was tempted out of retirement to save the team from relegation.</i>
tow	A rope or line used to tow a vehicle or boat. <i>She saw Florian towing Nicky along by the hand.</i>
trail	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>The torrential rain left a trail of devastation.</i>
tug	Tow a ship by means of a tugboat. <i>She tugged off her boots.</i>
underline	Emphasize (something). <i>She has a white tail and underline.</i>
woo	Try to gain the love of (someone), especially with a view to marriage. <i>China is wooing Russia.</i>
