A light pastry case typically one made of puff pastry containing a sweet or savoury filling.

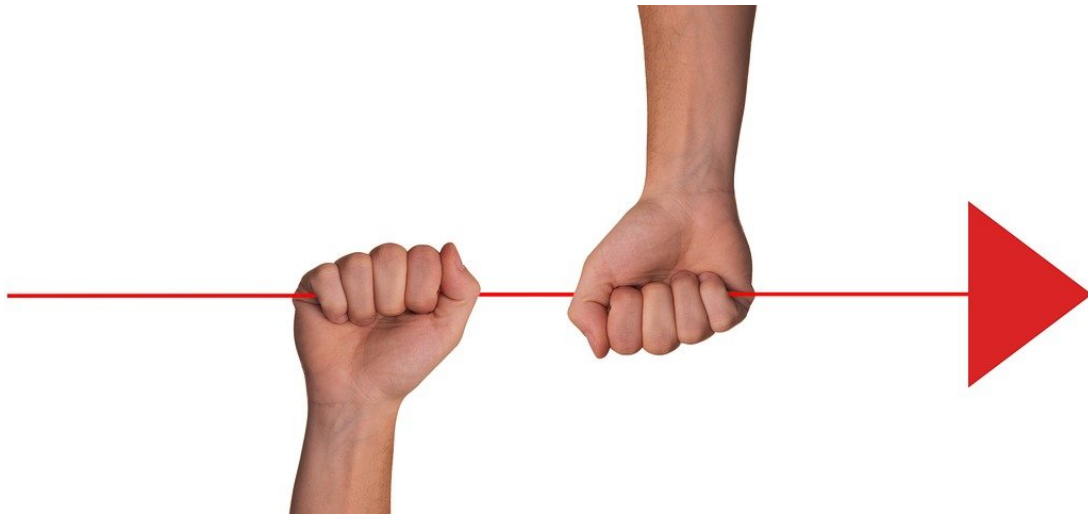
*The snowy beds were piled with plump pillows and **puffs**.*

### **pull**

An act of pulling something.

**retarding force** A person of subnormal intelligence.

### Definitions of "Drags" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "drags" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *To lag or linger behind.*
- *Suck in or take (air).*
- *Walk without lifting the feet.*
- *Use a computer mouse to move icons on the screen and select commands from a menu.*
- *Move slowly and as if with great effort.*
- *Draw slowly or heavily.*
- *Pull, as against a resistance.*
- *Persuade to come away from something attractive or interesting.*



- Force into some kind of situation, condition, or course of action.
- Proceed for an extended period of time.
- Search (as the bottom of a body of water) for something valuable or lost.

<b>cart</b>	Transport something in a cart. <i>My mother <b>carted</b> us around from one activity to another.</i>
<b>drag in</b>	Persuade to come away from something attractive or interesting.
<b>drag on</b>	Proceed for an extended period of time.
<b>drag out</b>	Force into some kind of situation, condition, or course of action.
<b>draw</b>	Engage in drawing. <i><b>Draw</b> wire.</i>
<b><u>dredge</u></b>	Bring up or clear something from a river harbour or other area of water with a dredge. <i>Mud was <b>dredged</b> out of the harbour.</i>

<b>drop back</b>	Stop associating with.
<b>drop behind</b>	Pay out.
	Bring into a state of confusion or disorder.
<b>embroil</b>	<i>What merit do you claim for having <b>embroiled</b> everything in which you are concerned.</i>
<b>get behind</b>	Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes).
<b>hale</b>	To cause to do through pressure or necessity, by physical, moral or intellectual means.
<b>hang back</b>	Be exhibited.
<b>haul</b>	Transport in a lorry or cart. <i><b>Haul</b> vegetables to the market.</i>
<b>puff</b>	Make proud or conceited. <i>He <b>puffed</b> on his pipe contentedly.</i>
<b>scuff</b>	Mar by scuffing. <i>For kids who play rough shoes that won't <b>scuff</b>.</i>
<b>sweep</b>	Make a big sweeping gesture or movement. <i>Please <b>sweep</b> the floor.</i>
<b>sweep up</b>	To cover or extend over an area or time period.
<b>tangle</b>	Tangle or complicate. <i>The child <b>entangled</b> the cord.</i>
<b>trail</b>	Give advance publicity to (a film, broadcast, or proposal). <i>Her voice <b>trailed</b> away.</i>





## Usage Examples of "Drags" as a verb

- *He dragged me away from the television set.*
- *The speech dragged on for two hours.*
- *Drag this icon to the lower right hand corner of the screen.*
- *These worries were dragging at him.*
- *He dragged the big suitcase behind him.*
- *Don't drag me into this business.*
- *But in so many other areas we still are dragging.*

<b>allure</b>	The power to entice or attract through personal charm. <i>People for whom gold holds no <b>allure</b>.</i>
<b>anchorage</b>	The condition of being secured to a base. <i>The plant needs a firm <b>anchorage</b>.</i>
<b>attract</b>	Be attractive to. <i>I was <b>attracted</b> to the idea of working for a ballet company.</i>
<b>barge</b>	Convey freight by barge. <i>We can't just <b>barge</b> into a private garden.</i>
<b>cart</b>	Transport something in a cart. <i>He used a hand<b>cart</b> to carry the rocks away.</i>
<b>draw</b>	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i><b>Draw</b> the shades.</i>
<b>dredge</b>	Bring up or clear something from a river harbour or other area of water with a dredge. <i>Mud was <b>dredged</b> out of the harbour.</i>
<b>drone</b>	A musical instrument or part of one sounding a continuous note of low pitch in particular also drone pipe a pipe in a bagpipe or also drone string a string in an instrument such as a hurdy gurdy or a sitar. <i>Pilots use remote controls to guide a stealth reconnaissance <b>drone</b>.</i>
<b>elicit</b>	Derive by reason. <i><b>Elicit</b> a solution.</i>
<b>embroil</b>	Force into some kind of situation, condition, or course of action. <i>She became <b>embroiled</b> in a dispute between two women she hardly knew.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Charming and attractive. <i>An <b>engaging</b> frankness.</i>
<b>entice</b>	Provoke someone to do something through (often false or exaggerated) promises or persuasion. <i>A show which should <b>entice</b> a new audience into the theatre.</i>
<b>gravitational</b>	Denoting a forceful attraction or movement towards something. <i>For many international companies Russia's <b>gravitational</b> pull is simply too strong to resist.</i>
<b>haul</b>	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>His seven goal <b>haul</b> against Liverpool.</i>
<b>haulage</b>	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>Road <b>haulage</b>.</i>

<b>ingratiating</b>	Intended to gain approval or favour; sycophantic. <i>An <b>ingratiating</b> manner.</i>
<b>intrigue</b>	Form intrigues for in an underhand manner. <i>Henry and Louis <b>intrigued</b> with the local nobles.</i>
<b>inviting</b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>The sea down there looks so <b>inviting</b>.</i>
<b>lug</b>	Carry or drag (a heavy or bulky object) with great effort. <i>You ll have to <b>lug</b> this suitcase.</i>
<b>lure</b>	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The child was <b>lured</b> into a car but managed to escape.</i>
<b>magnet</b>	A device that attracts iron and produces a magnetic field. <i>The beautiful stretch of white sand is a <b>magnet</b> for sun worshippers.</i>
<b>pull</b>	Bring take or pull out of a container or from under a cover. <i>One of the <b>pulls</b> of urban life is the opportunity of finding employment.</i>
<b>straighten</b>	Straighten by unrolling. <i>He slowly <b>straightened</b> up using the table for support.</i>
<b>tempt</b>	Give rise to a desire by being attractive or inviting. <i>We were <b>tempted</b> by the delicious looking food.</i>
<b>tow</b>	Of a motor vehicle or boat pull another vehicle or boat along with a rope chain or tow bar. <i>Horses used to <b>tow</b> barges along the canal.</i>
<b>trail</b>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>A <b>trail</b> of blood on the grass.</i>
<b>tug</b>	Tow a vessel with a tug. <i>The <b>tugboat</b> <b>tugged</b> the freighter into the harbor.</i>
<b>underline</b>	A line drawn under a word or phrase, especially for emphasis. <i>Certain phrases had been <b>underlined</b>.</i>
<b>woo</b>	Seek someone's favor. <i>He <b>wooed</b> her with quotes from Shakespeare.</i>
