
Drained as an Adjective

- Very tired.






Synonyms of "Drained" as an adjective (2 Words)

abandoned	Unrestrained; uninhibited. An abandoned sadness born of grief.
aqueduct	A conduit that resembles a bridge but carries water over a valley.
<u>basin</u>	The quantity that a basin will hold. <i>The Amazon basin.</i>
canal	Provide a city with a canal. They travelled on by canal .
<u>channel</u>	A service or station using a channel of frequencies. Channel information towards a broad audience.
<u>coast</u>	A slope down which sleds may coast. Once the coast to the moon had begun Apollo was separated from the third stage.



conduit	A channel for conveying water or other fluid. As an actor you have to be a conduit for other people s words.
countermand	Revoke or cancel (an order. I forthwith mounted and went off lest I should receive a countermand .
<u>deserted</u>	Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. Deserted beaches of soft sand.
<u>ditch</u>	Provide with a ditch or ditches. Ditch a plane.
drainage	The action or process of draining something. The drainage of wetlands.
<u>empty</u>	Become empty or void of its content. The room was empty of furniture.
<u>exhaust</u>	The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. We have exhaust ed the food supplies.
fluvial	Of or relating to or happening in a river. <i>Fluvial</i> deposits.
irrigate	(of a river or stream) supply (land) with water. <i>Irrigate</i> the wound.
<u>irrigation</u>	The process of washing out an organ or wound with a continuous flow of water or medication. The river supplies water for irrigation of agricultural crops.
<u>island</u>	A zone or area resembling an island. The island of Crete.
isthmus	A cord-like tissue connecting two larger parts of an anatomical structure.
moat	Surround a place with a moat.
navigable	Able to be sailed on or through safely. A good cart track navigable by cars.
peninsula	A large mass of land projecting into a body of water.
pipeline	Convey a substance by a pipeline. Chip designers pipeline the instructions given to the hardware.
<u>revoke</u>	Officially cancel (a decree, decision, or promise. <i>He revoked the ban on smoking.</i>
sedimentary	Produced by the action of water.
<u>soil</u>	Make soiled filthy or dirty. Don t soil your clothes when you play outside.
<u>trench</u>	Cut a trench in as for drainage. This would surely trench very far on the dignity and liberty of citizens.



tubular	Long, round, and hollow like a tube. Donatello is totally tubular when he s jamming.
<u>vacate</u>	Cancel or annul (a judgement, contract, or charge. <i>You must vacate your office by tonight.</i>
waterway	A conduit through which water flows. <i>The canal was a very successful commercial</i> waterway .
