Definitions of "Drained" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “drained” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Emptied or exhausted of (as by drawing off e.g. water or other liquid).*
- *Drained of electric charge; discharged.*
- *Very tired.*



Synonyms of "Drained" as an adjective (2 Words)

dead

Lacking emotion, sympathy, or sensitivity.

*The pitch was so utterly **dead** that Pollock could hardly get the ball bail high.*

Severely damaged or broken.

knackered *He had seen Sonny flying around on a **knackered** old bike for the last two weeks.*



Usage Examples of "Drained" as an adjective

- *A drained marsh.*
- *Left the lights on and came back to find the battery drained.*
- *A drained tank.*
- *A drained and apathetic old man...not caring any longer about anything.*

- abandoned** Unrestrained; uninhibited.
*An **abandoned** sadness born of grief.*
- aqueduct** A conduit that resembles a bridge but carries water over a valley.
- basin** The quantity that a basin will hold.
*The Amazon **basin**.*
- canal** Provide a city with a canal.
*They travelled on by **canal**.*
- channel** A service or station using a channel of frequencies.
***Channel** information towards a broad audience.*
- coast** A slope down which sleds may coast.
*Once the **coast** to the moon had begun Apollo was separated from the third stage.*

| conduit | A channel for conveying water or other fluid. <i>As an actor you have to be a conduit for other people's words.</i> |
| countermand | Revoke or cancel (an order). <i>I forthwith mounted and went off lest I should receive a countermand.</i> |
| <u>deserted</u> | Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. <i>Deserted beaches of soft sand.</i> |
| <u>ditch</u> | Provide with a ditch or ditches. <i>Ditch a plane.</i> |
| drainage | The action or process of draining something. <i>The drainage of wetlands.</i> |
| <u>empty</u> | Become empty or void of its content. <i>The room was empty of furniture.</i> |
| <u>exhaust</u> | The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. <i>We have exhausted the food supplies.</i> |
| fluvial | Of or relating to or happening in a river. <i>Fluvial deposits.</i> |
| irrigate | (of a river or stream) supply (land) with water. <i>Irrigate the wound.</i> |
| <u>irrigation</u> | The process of washing out an organ or wound with a continuous flow of water or medication. <i>The river supplies water for irrigation of agricultural crops.</i> |
| <u>island</u> | A zone or area resembling an island. <i>The island of Crete.</i> |
| isthmus | A cord-like tissue connecting two larger parts of an anatomical structure. |
| moat | Surround a place with a moat. |
| navigable | Able to be sailed on or through safely. <i>A good cart track navigable by cars.</i> |
| peninsula | A large mass of land projecting into a body of water. |
| pipeline | Convey a substance by a pipeline. <i>Chip designers pipeline the instructions given to the hardware.</i> |
| <u>revoke</u> | Officially cancel (a decree, decision, or promise). <i>He revoked the ban on smoking.</i> |
| sedimentary | Produced by the action of water. |
| <u>soil</u> | Make soiled filthy or dirty. <i>Don't soil your clothes when you play outside.</i> |
| <u>trench</u> | Cut a trench in as for drainage. <i>This would surely trench very far on the dignity and liberty of citizens.</i> |

tubular

Long, round, and hollow like a tube.
*Donatello is totally **tubular** when he s jamming.*

vacate

Cancel or annul (a judgement, contract, or charge).
*You must **vacate** your office by tonight.*

waterway

A conduit through which water flows.
*The canal was a very successful commercial **waterway**.*
