| attraction | The influence exerted by one word on another which causes it to change to an incorrect form, e.g. the wages of sin is (for are) death. <i>She has very romantic ideas about sexual attraction.</i> |
| bewitchment | A magical spell. |
| cachet | A warrant formerly issued by a French king who could warrant imprisonment or death in a signed letter under his seal. <i>Special cachets are applied to cards sold at the stands.</i> |
| charisma | Compelling attractiveness or charm that can inspire devotion in others. <i>He has tremendous charisma and stage presence.</i> |
| charm | A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number. <i>You re not going to charm me into changing my mind.</i> |
| dazzle | Amaze or overwhelm (someone) with a particular impressive quality. <i>I was dazzled by the beauty and breadth of the exhibition.</i> |
| demagnetize | Erase (a magnetic storage device). <i>Demagnetize the iron shavings.</i> |
| dote | Be silly or feeble-minded, especially as a result of old age. <i>Grandmother dots on the twins.</i> |
| drag | A hunt using a drag lure. <i>The coaster was dragging her anchor in St Ives Bay.</i> |

| electromagnet | A soft metal core made into a magnet by the passage of electric current through a coil surrounding it. |
| <u>enchant</u> | Fill (someone) with great delight; charm. <i>The scenery began to enchant her.</i> |
| <u>enchantment</u> | A feeling of great liking for something wonderful and unusual. <i>The enchantment of the mountains.</i> |
| engaging | Attracting or delighting. <i>An engaging frankness.</i> |
| <u>entrance</u> | An act or instance of entering somewhere. <i>The entrance to a tunnel.</i> |
| <u>fascinate</u> | To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>I've always been fascinated by computers.</i> |
| glamorize | Make glamorous and attractive. <i>The lyrics glamorize drugs.</i> |
| ingratiating | Capable of winning favor. <i>An ingratiating manner.</i> |
| intrigue | Form intrigues for in an underhand manner. <i>Henry and Louis intrigued with the local nobles.</i> |
| <u>inviting</u> | Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i> |
| <u>magnet</u> | Physics a device that attracts iron and produces a magnetic field. <i>The beautiful stretch of white sand is a magnet for sun worshippers.</i> |
| mesmerize | Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. <i>He was mesmerized when at the point of death.</i> |
| spellbind | Put into a trance. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i> |
| <u>splendor</u> | The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. <i>It is the university that gives the scene its stately splendor.</i> |
| superconductivity | The disappearance of electrical resistance at very low temperatures. |
| <u>tempt</u> | Try to seduce. <i>He lured me into temptation.</i> |
| winsome | Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i> |
