### Definitions of "Dreamer" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dreamer” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Someone who is dreaming.*
- *A person who has lived in the US without official authorization since coming to the country as a minor. People of this description who met certain conditions would be eligible for a special immigration status under federal legislation first proposed in 2001.*
- *A person who escapes into a world of fantasy.*
- *Someone guided more by ideals than by practical considerations.*
- *A person who dreams or is dreaming.*
- *A person who is unpractical or idealistic.*



## Synonyms of "Dreamer" as a noun (6 Words)

<b>daydreamer</b>	Someone who indulges in idle or absentminded daydreaming.
<b>escapist</b>	An inclination to retreat from unpleasant realities through diversion or fantasy. <i>The perfect <b>escapist</b> s paradise almost as remote as a desert island.</i>
<b>fantasist</b>	A person who imagines or dreams about something desired. <i>A <b>fantasist</b> with delusions of grandeur.</i>
<b>fantasizer</b>	A person who indulges in daydreaming or fantasizing. <i>Some <b>fantasizers</b> superimpose their daydreams on to their daily tasks.</i>
<b>idealist</b>	A person who is guided more by ideals than by practical considerations. <i>Hegel described himself as an absolute <b>idealist</b>.</i>
<b>wishful thinker</b>	The particular preference that you have.

<b>chimerical</b>	<i>His Utopia is not a <b>chimerical</b> commonwealth but a practical improvement on what already exists.</i>
<b>daydream</b>	Indulge in a daydream. <i>Stop <b>daydreaming</b> and pay attention.</i>
<b>delusion</b>	The action of deluding or the state of being deluded. <i>What a capacity television has for <b>delusion</b>.</i>
<b>dreaming</b>	A series of mental images and emotions occurring during sleep.
<b>dreamland</b>	Sleep regarded as a world of dreams. <i>She tries to lull herself into <b>dreamland</b>.</i>
<b>dreamy</b>	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>A <b>dreamy</b> boy who grew up absorbed in poetry.</i>
<b>envisage</b>	Form a mental image of something that is not present or that is not the case. <i>The Rome Treaty <b>envisaged</b> free movement across frontiers.</i>
<b>escapism</b>	The tendency to seek distraction and relief from unpleasant realities, especially by seeking entertainment or engaging in fantasy. <i>Virtual reality offers a form of <b>escapism</b>.</i>
<b>fancied</b>	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A <b>fancied</b> wrong.</i>
<b>fanciful</b>	Not based on fact; unreal- F.D.Roosevelt. <i>The falsehood about some <b>fanciful</b> secret treaties.</i>
<b>fantasy</b>	Imagine the occurrence of; fantasize about. <i>His researches had moved into the realms of <b>fantasy</b>.</i>
<b>fictitious</b>	Adopted in order to deceive. <i>A <b>fictitious</b> address.</i>
<b>hypnosis</b>	A state that resembles sleep but that is induced by suggestion. <i>I was regressed under <b>hypnosis</b>.</i>
<b>idealist</b>	Someone guided more by ideals than by practical considerations. <i>Hegel described himself as an absolute <b>idealist</b>.</i>
<b>idealistic</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i><b>Idealistic</b> young doctors who went to work for the rebels.</i>
<b>illusion</b>	Something many people believe that is false. <i>He had no <b>illusions</b> about the trouble she was in.</i>
<b>illusive</b>	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. <i>An <b>illusive</b> haven.</i>

<b>illusory</b>	Based on illusion; not real. <i>She knew the safety of her room was <b>illusory</b>.</i>
<b>imagery</b>	Visual images collectively. <i>The film s religious <b>imagery</b>.</i>
<b>imaginary</b>	Not based on fact; existing only in the imagination. <i>Chris had <b>imaginary</b> conversations with her.</i>
<b>imagine</b>	Expect, believe, or suppose. <i>I <b>imagine</b> she earned a lot of money with her new novel.</i>
<b>paradise</b>	(Christianity) the abode of righteous souls after death. <i>My idea of <b>paradise</b> is to relax on the seafront.</i>
<b>psyche</b>	The human soul, mind, or spirit. <i>Their childhood made them want to understand the human <b>psyche</b> and to help others.</i>
<b>reverie</b>	Absentminded dreaming while awake. <i>I slipped into <b>reverie</b>.</i>
<b>soul</b>	A human being. <i>It was bad news for some poor <b>soul</b>.</i>
<b>surreal</b>	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. <i>A <b>surreal</b> mix of fact and fantasy.</i>
<b>utopia</b>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political <b>utopias</b> has led to ruin.</i>
<b>vision</b>	The images seen on a television screen. <i>The box converts the digital signal into sound and <b>vision</b> on an ordinary TV.</i>
<b>visionary</b>	A person with original ideas about what the future will or could be like. <i><b>Visionary</b> dreams.</i>
<b>visualize</b>	Imagine; conceive of; see in one's mind. <i>With this machine ultrasound can be <b>visualized</b>.</i>
