Definitions of "Dreamer" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dreamer” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Someone who is dreaming.*
- *A person who has lived in the US without official authorization since coming to the country as a minor. People of this description who met certain conditions would be eligible for a special immigration status under federal legislation first proposed in 2001.*
- *A person who escapes into a world of fantasy.*
- *Someone guided more by ideals than by practical considerations.*
- *A person who dreams or is dreaming.*
- *A person who is unpractical or idealistic.*



Synonyms of "Dreamer" as a noun (6 Words)

daydreamer	Someone who indulges in idle or absentminded daydreaming.
escapist	An inclination to retreat from unpleasant realities through diversion or fantasy. <i>The perfect escapist s paradise almost as remote as a desert island.</i>
fantasist	A person who imagines or dreams about something desired. <i>A fantasist with delusions of grandeur.</i>
fantasizer	A person who indulges in daydreaming or fantasizing. <i>Some fantasizers superimpose their daydreams on to their daily tasks.</i>
idealist	A person who is guided more by ideals than by practical considerations. <i>Hegel described himself as an absolute idealist.</i>
wishful thinker	The particular preference that you have.

- *She found out the Department of Transportation was not going to grant driving licences to DREAMers.*

chimerical	<i>His Utopia is not a chimerical commonwealth but a practical improvement on what already exists.</i>
daydream	Indulge in a daydream. <i>Stop daydreaming and pay attention.</i>
delusion	The action of deluding or the state of being deluded. <i>What a capacity television has for delusion.</i>
dreaming	A series of mental images and emotions occurring during sleep.
dreamland	Sleep regarded as a world of dreams. <i>She tries to lull herself into dreamland.</i>
dreamy	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>A dreamy boy who grew up absorbed in poetry.</i>
envisage	Form a mental image of something that is not present or that is not the case. <i>The Rome Treaty envisaged free movement across frontiers.</i>
escapism	The tendency to seek distraction and relief from unpleasant realities, especially by seeking entertainment or engaging in fantasy. <i>Virtual reality offers a form of escapism.</i>
fancied	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A fancied wrong.</i>
fanciful	Not based on fact; unreal- F.D.Roosevelt. <i>The falsehood about some fanciful secret treaties.</i>
fantasy	Imagine the occurrence of; fantasize about. <i>His researches had moved into the realms of fantasy.</i>
fictitious	Adopted in order to deceive. <i>A fictitious address.</i>
hypnosis	A state that resembles sleep but that is induced by suggestion. <i>I was regressed under hypnosis.</i>
idealist	Someone guided more by ideals than by practical considerations. <i>Hegel described himself as an absolute idealist.</i>
idealistic	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>Idealistic young doctors who went to work for the rebels.</i>
illusion	Something many people believe that is false. <i>He had no illusions about the trouble she was in.</i>
illusive	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. <i>An illusive haven.</i>

illusory	Based on illusion; not real. <i>She knew the safety of her room was illusory.</i>
imagery	Visual images collectively. <i>The film s religious imagery.</i>
imaginary	Not based on fact; existing only in the imagination. <i>Chris had imaginary conversations with her.</i>
imagine	Expect, believe, or suppose. <i>I imagine she earned a lot of money with her new novel.</i>
paradise	(Christianity) the abode of righteous souls after death. <i>My idea of paradise is to relax on the seafront.</i>
psyche	The human soul, mind, or spirit. <i>Their childhood made them want to understand the human psyche and to help others.</i>
reverie	Absentminded dreaming while awake. <i>I slipped into reverie.</i>
soul	A human being. <i>It was bad news for some poor soul.</i>
surreal	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. <i>A surreal mix of fact and fantasy.</i>
utopia	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political utopias has led to ruin.</i>
vision	The images seen on a television screen. <i>The box converts the digital signal into sound and vision on an ordinary TV.</i>
visionary	A person with original ideas about what the future will or could be like. <i>Visionary dreams.</i>
visualize	Imagine; conceive of; see in one's mind. <i>With this machine ultrasound can be visualized.</i>
