<b>asleep</b>	Lacking sensation. <i>A man lay <b>asleep</b>.</i>
<b>awake</b>	Not in a state of sleep; completely conscious. <i>Still not fully <b>awake</b>.</i>
<b>bed</b>	Place plants in a prepared bed of soil. <i>He sat on the edge of the <b>bed</b>.</i>
<b>daydream</b>	Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy. <i>She was lost in a <b>daydream</b>.</i>
<b>doze</b>	A light fitful sleep. <i>I <b>dozed</b> off for a few seconds.</i>
<b>dreamy</b>	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>The atmosphere is tranquil and <b>dreamy</b>.</i>

<b>drowse</b>	Make sleepy. <i>Let not your prudence <b>drowse</b>.</i>
<b>drowsiness</b>	A very sleepy state. <i>This drug can cause <b>drowsiness</b>.</i>
<b><u>drowsy</u></b>	Causing sleepiness. <i>Made <b>drowsy</b> by the long ride.</i>
<b><u>envision</u></b>	Picture to oneself; imagine possible. <i>She <b>envisioned</b> the admiring glances of guests seeing her home.</i>
<b>hypnosis</b>	A hypnotic state. <i>I was regressed under <b>hypnosis</b>.</i>
<b>hypnotism</b>	The act of inducing hypnosis. Based on or having the nature of an illusion.
<b>illusory</b>	<i>Secret activities offer presidents the alluring but often <b>illusory</b> promise that they can achieve foreign policy goals without the bothersome debate and open decision that are staples of democracy.</i>
<b><u>imaginary</u></b>	Existing only in the imagination. <i>Chris had <b>imaginary</b> conversations with her.</i>
<b>mesmerism</b>	The act of inducing hypnosis.
<b>nap</b>	A soft or fuzzy surface texture. <i>She took to <b>napping</b> on the beach in the afternoons.</i>
<b><u>nightmare</u></b>	A frightening or unpleasant dream. <i>The <b>nightmare</b> of racial hatred.</i>
<b>oversleep</b>	Sleep longer or later than one intended. <i>We talked until the early hours and consequently I overslept.</i>
<b><u>reverie</u></b>	An abstracted state of absorption. <i>His own compositions can move from impressionist <b>reveries</b> to an orchestral chordal approach.</i>
<b>rouse</b>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>She <b>roused</b> and looked around.</i>
<b>sleep</b>	A gummy secretion found in the corners of the eyes after sleep. <i>He <b>sleeps</b> in Holywell cemetery.</i>
<b><u>sleepy</u></b>	Needing or ready for sleep. <i>He turned off the road into a <b>sleepy</b> little town.</i>
<b><u>slumber</u></b>	Sleep. <i>Calm as a child in dreamless <b>slumber</b>.</i>
<b>snore</b>	Make a snorting or grunting sound while asleep. <i>She sings a version of Passionate Kisses that s a certified <b>snore</b>.</i>

**somnolence** A very sleepy state.

**somnolent** Inclined to or marked by drowsiness.  
*The sound had a **somnolent** effect.*

**subconscious** The subconscious part of the mind not in technical use in psychoanalysis where unconscious is preferred.  
*My **subconscious** fear.*

**visualize** Form a mental image of; imagine.  
*Mathematicians often **visualize**.*

**waken** Cause to become awake or conscious.  
*They combined to **waken** a forgotten and futile hope.*

**waking** Marked by full consciousness or alertness.  
*Worked every moment of my **waking** hours.*
