abstractly	In abstract terms.
ambition	Have as one's ambition. <i>He achieved his ambition of making a fortune.</i>
aspiration	A hope or ambition of achieving something. <i>Bathing solutions were changed by careful aspiration.</i>
awake	Regain consciousness. <i>Awake to the dangers of her situation.</i>
chimerical	Being or relating to or like a chimera. <i>His Utopia is not a chimerical commonwealth but a practical improvement on what already exists.</i>
daydream	Indulge in a daydream. <i>She was lost in a daydream.</i>
delusion	The act of deluding; deception by creating illusory ideas. <i>What a capacity television has for delusion.</i>
dreaming	A series of mental images and emotions occurring during sleep.
dreamy	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>A dreamy boy who grew up absorbed in poetry.</i>
envisage	Form a mental picture of (something not yet existing or known). <i>The Rome Treaty envisaged free movement across frontiers.</i>
envision	Picture to oneself; imagine possible. <i>I cannot envision him as President.</i>
fancy	Have a fancy or particular liking or desire for. <i>Never had the wildest flights of fancy imagined such magnificence.</i>
fantasy	Fiction with a large amount of imagination in it. <i>A schoolgirl fantasy.</i>
hallucination	An experience involving the apparent perception of something not present. <i>His dreams of vast wealth are a hallucination.</i>

idea	A mental impression. <i>He has an idea that we don't like him.</i>
ideational	Being of the nature of a notion or concept. <i>Policy has been shaped by both material and ideational factors.</i>
illusion	An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception of a sensory experience. <i>They have the illusion that I am very wealthy.</i>
imaginable	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views imaginable.</i>
<u>imagination</u>	The part of the mind that imagines things. <i>He could still hear her in his imagination.</i>
inspiration	A sudden brilliant or timely idea. <i>Then I had an inspiration.</i>
megalomania	Obsession with the exercise of power.
<u>nightmare</u>	A terrifying or deeply upsetting dream. <i>The nightmare of racial hatred.</i>
oversleep	Sleep longer than intended. <i>We talked until the early hours and consequently I overslept.</i>
<u>paranoia</u>	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. <i>Mild paranoia afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
paranoiac	A person suffering from paranoia. <i>Nonsensical paranoiac ramblings.</i>
<u>reverie</u>	An instrumental piece suggesting a dreamy or musing state. <i>His own compositions can move from impressionist reveries to an orchestral chordal approach.</i>
sleep	Be able to accommodate for sleeping. <i>This tent sleeps six people.</i>
<u>visionary</u>	(of a scheme or idea) not practical. <i>A visionary leader.</i>
<u>visualize</u>	Form a mental image of; imagine. <i>The radiologist can visualize the cancerous liver.</i>
waking	The state of remaining awake. <i>Days of danger and nights of waking.</i>
