## Associations of "Dreams" (30 Words)

<b>abstractly</b>	In abstract terms.
<b>ambition</b>	Have as one's ambition. <i>He achieved his <b>ambition</b> of making a fortune.</i>
<b><a href="#">aspiration</a></b>	A hope or ambition of achieving something. <i>Bathing solutions were changed by careful <b>aspiration</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">awake</a></b>	Regain consciousness. <i><b>Awake</b> to the dangers of her situation.</i>
<b>chimerical</b>	Being or relating to or like a chimera. <i>His Utopia is not a <b>chimerical</b> commonwealth but a practical improvement on what already exists.</i>
<b>daydream</b>	Indulge in a daydream. <i>She was lost in a <b>daydream</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">delusion</a></b>	The act of deluding; deception by creating illusory ideas. <i>What a capacity television has for <b>delusion</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">dreaming</a></b>	A series of mental images and emotions occurring during sleep.
<b>dreamy</b>	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>A <b>dreamy</b> boy who grew up absorbed in poetry.</i>
<b>envisage</b>	Form a mental picture of (something not yet existing or known). <i>The Rome Treaty <b>envisaged</b> free movement across frontiers.</i>
<b><a href="#">envision</a></b>	Picture to oneself; imagine possible. <i>I cannot <b>envision</b> him as President.</i>
<b>fancy</b>	Have a fancy or particular liking or desire for. <i>Never had the wildest flights of <b>fancy</b> imagined such magnificence.</i>
<b><a href="#">fantasy</a></b>	Fiction with a large amount of imagination in it. <i>A schoolgirl <b>fantasy</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">hallucination</a></b>	An experience involving the apparent perception of something not present. <i>His dreams of vast wealth are a <b>hallucination</b>.</i>

<b>idea</b>	A mental impression. <i>He has an <b>idea</b> that we don't like him.</i>
<b>ideational</b>	Being of the nature of a notion or concept. <i>Policy has been shaped by both material and <b>ideational</b> factors.</i>
<b>illusion</b>	An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception of a sensory experience. <i>They have the <b>illusion</b> that I am very wealthy.</i>
<b>imaginable</b>	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views <b>imaginable</b>.</i>
<b><u>imagination</u></b>	The part of the mind that imagines things. <i>He could still hear her in his <b>imagination</b>.</i>
<b>inspiration</b>	A sudden brilliant or timely idea. <i>Then I had an <b>inspiration</b>.</i>
<b>megalomania</b>	Obsession with the exercise of power.
<b><u>nightmare</u></b>	A terrifying or deeply upsetting dream. <i>The <b>nightmare</b> of racial hatred.</i>
<b>oversleep</b>	Sleep longer than intended. <i>We talked until the early hours and consequently I overslept.</i>
<b><u>paranoia</u></b>	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. <i>Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
<b>paranoiac</b>	A person suffering from paranoia. <i>Nonsensical <b>paranoiac</b> ramblings.</i>
<b><u>reverie</u></b>	An instrumental piece suggesting a dreamy or musing state. <i>His own compositions can move from impressionist <b>reveries</b> to an orchestral chordal approach.</i>
<b>sleep</b>	Be able to accommodate for sleeping. <i>This tent <b>sleeps</b> six people.</i>
<b><u>visionary</u></b>	(of a scheme or idea) not practical. <i>A <b>visionary</b> leader.</i>
<b><u>visualize</u></b>	Form a mental image of; imagine. <i>The radiologist can <b>visualize</b> the cancerous liver.</i>
<b>waking</b>	The state of remaining awake. <i>Days of danger and nights of <b>waking</b>.</i>
