- awash** Containing large numbers or amounts of someone or something.  
*A rock **awash** outside the reef entrance.*
- covered** Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form.  
*A **covered** balcony.*
- damp** Damp air or atmosphere.  
*A **damped** suspension that isolates the chassis from external vibration.*
- dampness** A slight wetness.  
*The **dampness** in the air.*
- dank** Unpleasantly cool and humid.  
***Dank** rain forests.*
- drench** Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged.  
*Three times a year **drenching** for calves.*

<b>dusty</b>	Covered with a layer of dust. <i>A <b>dusty</b> pile of books.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Filled or abounding with fog or mist. <i>She was <b>foggy</b> with sleep.</i>
<b>humid</b>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>A hot and <b>humid</b> day.</i>
<b>lowland</b>	Of relatively low or level country. <i>Economic power gravitated towards the <b>lowlands</b>.</i>
<b>marshland</b>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Acres of meadows and <b>marshlands</b>.</i>
<b>marshy</b>	Characteristic of or resembling a marsh; waterlogged. <i>A <b>marshy</b> coastline.</i>
<b>misty</b>	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>moist</b>	(of a climate) rainy. <i>Her brother's eyes became <b>moist</b>.</i>
<b>moisture</b>	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>In freshly felled wood the <b>moisture</b> content varies.</i>
<b>moisturize</b>	Make (something, especially the skin) less dry. <i>Revitalize your face <b>moisturize</b> your skin.</i>
<b>muddy</b>	Cause to become muddy. <i>The original colours were blurred into <b>muddy</b> pink and yellow.</i>
<b>rain</b>	Rain falls. <i>It was beginning to <b>rain</b>.</i>
<b>rainy</b>	(of weather, a period, or an area) having or characterized by considerable rainfall. <i><b>Rainy</b> days.</i>
<b>saturated</b>	Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats. <i>The glitzy media <b>saturated</b> plasticity of Los Angeles.</i>
<b>snow</b>	Fall as snow. <i>The first <b>snows</b> of winter.</i>
<b>soak</b>	Washing something by allowing it to soak. <i>Don't disturb the wound <b>soak</b> the dressing off if necessary.</i>

- soaked** Extremely wet; saturated.  
*Rain **soaked** streets.*
- sodden** Wet through and through; thoroughly wet.  
*His clothes were **sodden**.*
- soggy** (of soil) soft and watery.  
*The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately **soggy**.*
- splashing** The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.
- swampy** (of soil) soft and watery.  
*A **swampy** area.*
- tropics** The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
- vapor** The process of becoming a vapor.
- Make one's bed or clothes wet by urinating.
- wet** *Our programme depends on our willingness to help other alcoholics both **wet** and dry.*
