- awash** Containing large numbers or amounts of someone or something.
*A rock **awash** outside the reef entrance.*
- covered** Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form.
*A **covered** balcony.*
- damp** Damp air or atmosphere.
*A **damped** suspension that isolates the chassis from external vibration.*
- dampness** A slight wetness.
*The **dampness** in the air.*
- dank** Unpleasantly cool and humid.
***Dank** rain forests.*
- drench** Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged.
*Three times a year **drenching** for calves.*

dusty	Covered with a layer of dust. <i>A dusty pile of books.</i>
foggy	Filled or abounding with fog or mist. <i>She was foggy with sleep.</i>
humid	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>A hot and humid day.</i>
lowland	Of relatively low or level country. <i>Economic power gravitated towards the lowlands.</i>
marshland	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Acres of meadows and marshlands.</i>
marshy	Characteristic of or resembling a marsh; waterlogged. <i>A marshy coastline.</i>
misty	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>The misty air above the frozen river.</i>
moist	(of a climate) rainy. <i>Her brother's eyes became moist.</i>
moisture	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>In freshly felled wood the moisture content varies.</i>
moisturize	Make (something, especially the skin) less dry. <i>Revitalize your face moisturize your skin.</i>
muddy	Cause to become muddy. <i>The original colours were blurred into muddy pink and yellow.</i>
rain	Rain falls. <i>It was beginning to rain.</i>
rainy	(of weather, a period, or an area) having or characterized by considerable rainfall. <i>Rainy days.</i>
saturated	Denoting fats containing a high proportion of fatty acid molecules without double bonds considered to be less healthy in the diet than unsaturated fats. <i>The glitzy media saturated plasticity of Los Angeles.</i>
snow	Fall as snow. <i>The first snows of winter.</i>
soak	Washing something by allowing it to soak. <i>Don't disturb the wound soak the dressing off if necessary.</i>

- soaked** Extremely wet; saturated.
*Rain **soaked** streets.*
- sodden** Wet through and through; thoroughly wet.
*His clothes were **sodden**.*
- soggy** (of soil) soft and watery.
*The chorus sings powerfully but the interpretation is ultimately **soggy**.*
- splashing** The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.
- swampy** (of soil) soft and watery.
*A **swampy** area.*
- tropics** The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
- vapor** The process of becoming a vapor.
- Make one's bed or clothes wet by urinating.
- wet** *Our programme depends on our willingness to help other alcoholics both **wet** and dry.*
