Definitions of "Dressed" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "dressed" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
- (of a person) wearing clothes; not naked or in underwear, sleepwear, etc.
- (of lumber or stone) to trim and smooth.
- (of stone) having had the surface smoothed.
- To trim and smooth.
- (of a salad) having a dressing added.
- (of food, especially poultry or shellfish) cleaned and prepared for cooking or eating.
- Treated with medications and protective covering.
- Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.
- (of an artificial fly) made for use in fishing.


