## Dressed as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Dressed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dressed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.*
- *(of a person) wearing clothes; not naked or in underwear, sleepwear, etc.*
- *(of lumber or stone) to trim and smooth.*
- *(of stone) having had the surface smoothed.*
- *To trim and smooth.*
- *(of a salad) having a dressing added.*
- *(of food, especially poultry or shellfish) cleaned and prepared for cooking or eating.*
- *Treated with medications and protective covering.*
- *Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.*
- *(of an artificial fly) made for use in fishing.*



## Synonyms of "Dressed" as an adjective (13 Words)

<b>appareled</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
<b>attired</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>The elegantly <b>attired</b> gentleman.</i>
<b>dressed to kill</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
<b>dressed to the nines</b>	Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.
<b>dressed-up</b>	Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.
<b>garbed</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>Monks <b>garbed</b> in hooded robes.</i>

<b>garmented</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>Went about oddly <b>garmented</b>.</i>
<b>habilimented</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
<b>polished</b>	(of grains especially rice) having the husk or outer layers removed. <i>In a freshly ironed dress and <b>polished</b> shoes.</i>
<b>robed</b>	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>A circle of <b>robed</b> figures.</i>
<b>spiffed up</b>	Used up.
<b>spruced up</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners.
<b>togged up</b>	Out of bed.



## Usage Examples of "Dressed" as an adjective

- *A dressed wet fly.*
- *Neatly dressed workers.*
- *Go downstairs and wait for me! I'm not dressed!*
- *Dressed Cotswold stone.*
- *Dressed crab.*
- *Serve with dressed salad leaves.*
- *She was always beautifully dressed.*
- *A fine frontage in red brick with dressed white stone on the facings.*

**apparel**      Clothing in general.  
*They were dressed in bright **apparel**.*

<b>arranged</b>	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>The carefully <b>arranged</b> chessmen.</i>
<b>attire</b>	Clothes, especially fine or formal ones. <i>Lady Agatha was <b>attired</b> in an elaborate evening gown.</i>
<b>caparison</b>	Put a caparison on. <i><b>Caparison</b> the horses for the festive occasion.</i>
<b>clad</b>	Covered with cladding. <i>Copper <b>clad</b> boards.</i>
<b>cleanly</b>	In a way that produces no dirt, noxious gases, or other pollutants. <i><b>Cleanly</b> in their persons and habitations.</i>
<b>clothed</b>	Wearing or provided with clothing; sometimes used in combination- Bible. <i><b>Clothed</b> and in his right mind.</i>
<b>clothes</b>	Bedclothes. <i>Baby <b>clothes</b>.</i>
<b>clothing</b>	A covering designed to be worn on a person's body. <i>Bring warm <b>clothing</b> and waterproofs.</i>
<b>costume</b>	Dress in a costume. <i>He wore his national <b>costume</b>.</i>
<b>decorated</b>	Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.
<b>don</b>	A high-ranking member of the Mafia. <i>The princess <b>donned</b> a long blue dress.</i>
<b>dress</b>	Dress in a certain manner. <i><b>Dress</b> the plants in the garden.</i>
<b>equip</b>	Provide with (something) usually for a specific purpose. <i>All bedrooms are <b>equipped</b> with a colour TV.</i>
<b>fit</b>	The particular way in which something especially a garment or component fits. <i>The party was <b>fit</b> to govern.</i>
<b>hosiery</b>	Socks and stockings and tights collectively (the British include underwear).
<b>laundress</b>	A working woman who takes in washing.
<b>laundry</b>	A room in a house, hotel, or institution where clothes and linen can be washed and ironed. <i>The pathology department was in the hospital basement next to the <b>laundry</b>.</i>
<b>masquerade</b>	Take part in a masquerade. <i>A beggar s <b>masquerade</b> of wealth.</i>

<b>neatly</b>	In a neat way. <i>She <b>neatly</b> sidestepped the question.</i>
<b><u>outfit</u></b>	A complete set of equipment needed for a particular purpose. <i>Planes <b>outfitted</b> with sophisticated electronic gear.</i>
<b>skimpy</b>	Containing little excess. <i>A <b>skimpy</b> dress.</i>
<b>suit</b>	Slang a businessman dressed in a business suit. <i>A <b>suit</b> of armour.</i>
<b>swimsuit</b>	Tight fitting garment worn for swimming.
<b>toga</b>	A one-piece cloak worn by men in ancient Rome.
<b>undergarment</b>	A garment worn under other garments.
<b>underwear</b>	Clothing worn under other clothes, typically next to the skin.
<b><u>uniform</u></b>	Make uniform. <i>Airline pilots in dark blue <b>uniforms</b>.</i>
<b>uniformed</b>	Dressed in a uniform. <i><b>Uniformed</b> policemen lined the President's route.</i>
<b>wear</b>	Have in one's aspect wear an expression of one's attitude or personality. <i><b>Wear</b> one's hair in a certain way.</i>
