Definitions of "Dressed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “dressed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.*
- *(of a person) wearing clothes; not naked or in underwear, sleepwear, etc.*
- *(of lumber or stone) to trim and smooth.*
- *(of stone) having had the surface smoothed.*
- *To trim and smooth.*
- *(of a salad) having a dressing added.*
- *(of food, especially poultry or shellfish) cleaned and prepared for cooking or eating.*
- *Treated with medications and protective covering.*
- *Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.*
- *(of an artificial fly) made for use in fishing.*



Synonyms of "Dressed" as an adjective (13 Words)

appareled	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
attired	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>The elegantly attired gentleman.</i>
dressed to kill	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
dressed to the nines	Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.
dressed-up	Dressed in fancy or formal clothing.
garbed	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>Monks garbed in hooded robes.</i>

garmented	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>Went about oddly garmented.</i>
habilimented	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination.
polished	(of grains especially rice) having the husk or outer layers removed. <i>In a freshly ironed dress and polished shoes.</i>
robed	Dressed or clothed especially in fine attire; often used in combination. <i>A circle of robed figures.</i>
spiffed up	Used up.
spruced up	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners.
togged up	Out of bed.



Usage Examples of "Dressed" as an adjective

- *A dressed wet fly.*
- *Neatly dressed workers.*
- *Go downstairs and wait for me! I'm not dressed!*
- *Dressed Cotswold stone.*
- *Dressed crab.*
- *Serve with dressed salad leaves.*
- *She was always beautifully dressed.*
- *A fine frontage in red brick with dressed white stone on the facings.*



Associations of "Dressed" (30 Words)

apparel Clothing in general.
*They were dressed in bright **apparel**.*

arranged	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>The carefully arranged chessmen.</i>
<u>attire</u>	Clothes, especially fine or formal ones. <i>Lady Agatha was attired in an elaborate evening gown.</i>
caparison	Put a caparison on. <i>Caparison the horses for the festive occasion.</i>
clad	Covered with cladding. <i>Copper clad boards.</i>
cleanly	In a way that produces no dirt, noxious gases, or other pollutants. <i>Cleanly in their persons and habitations.</i>
clothed	Wearing or provided with clothing; sometimes used in combination- Bible. <i>Clothed and in his right mind.</i>
clothes	Bedclothes. <i>Baby clothes.</i>
clothing	A covering designed to be worn on a person's body. <i>Bring warm clothing and waterproofs.</i>
<u>costume</u>	Dress in a costume. <i>He wore his national costume.</i>
decorated	Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.
<u>don</u>	A high-ranking member of the Mafia. <i>The princess donned a long blue dress.</i>
<u>dress</u>	Dress in a certain manner. <i>Dress the plants in the garden.</i>
<u>equip</u>	Provide with (something) usually for a specific purpose. <i>All bedrooms are equipped with a colour TV.</i>
fit	The particular way in which something especially a garment or component fits. <i>The party was fit to govern.</i>
hosiery	Socks and stockings and tights collectively (the British include underwear).
laundress	A working woman who takes in washing.
laundry	A room in a house, hotel, or institution where clothes and linen can be washed and ironed. <i>The pathology department was in the hospital basement next to the laundry.</i>
masquerade	Take part in a masquerade. <i>A beggar s masquerade of wealth.</i>

neatly	In a neat way. <i>She neatly sidestepped the question.</i>
<u>outfit</u>	A complete set of equipment needed for a particular purpose. <i>Planes outfitted with sophisticated electronic gear.</i>
skimpy	Containing little excess. <i>A skimpy dress.</i>
suit	Slang a businessman dressed in a business suit. <i>A suit of armour.</i>
swimsuit	Tight fitting garment worn for swimming.
toga	A one-piece cloak worn by men in ancient Rome.
undergarment	A garment worn under other garments.
underwear	Clothing worn under other clothes, typically next to the skin.
<u>uniform</u>	Make uniform. <i>Airline pilots in dark blue uniforms.</i>
uniformed	Dressed in a uniform. <i>Uniformed policemen lined the President's route.</i>
wear	Have in one's aspect wear an expression of one's attitude or personality. <i>Wear one's hair in a certain way.</i>
