Definitions of "Drily" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “drily” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a matter-of-fact or ironically humorous way.*
- *In a dry way or condition.*
- *In a dry laconic manner.*



Synonyms of "Drily" as an adverb (2 Words)

dryly In a dry laconic manner he said dryly.
*I know that he said **dryly**.*

laconically In a dry laconic manner.



Usage Examples of "Drily" as an adverb

- *Evans swallowed drily.*
- *'How very observant', he said drily.*



Associations of "Drily" (30 Words)

- anhydrous** Without water; especially without water of crystallization.
- arid** Lacking sufficient water or rainfall.
*An **arid** climate.*
- aridity** A deficiency of moisture (especially when resulting from a permanent absence of rainfall).
- blacken** Make or become black.
*Stone **blackened** by the soot of ages.*
- char** Material that has been charred.
*Without a drenching rain the forest fire will **char** everything.*

climatic	Relating to climate. <i>Under certain climatic conditions desert locusts increase in number.</i>
dehydrate	Preserve by removing all water and liquids from. <i>Carry dehydrated food on your camping trip.</i>
desert	Desert a cause a country or an army often in order to join the opposing cause country or army. <i>The tourists have deserted the beaches.</i>
desiccant	A hygroscopic substance used as a drying agent. <i>A small packet of desiccant to absorb any moisture.</i>
desiccate	Preserve by removing all water and liquids from. <i>A prissy and emotionless creature settles into a mold of desiccated snobbery.</i>
desiccated	Thoroughly dried out. <i>Desiccated representatives of the political establishment.</i>
desiccation	Dryness resulting from the removal of water. <i>Stems were stored in plastic bags to prevent desiccation.</i>
dried	Preserved by removal or evaporation of moisture. <i>Dried lavender flowers.</i>
drought	Thirst. <i>Farmers most affected by the drought hope that there may yet be sufficient rain early in the growing season.</i>
dryness	Lack or absence of rainfall or humidity. <i>It does little to rescue the ordinary moment from dryness and tedium.</i>
evaporate	Cause to change into a vapor. <i>This gets the oil hot enough to evaporate any moisture.</i>
evaporation	The process of turning from liquid into vapour. <i>Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid evaporation of their retirement plans.</i>
famish	Die of food deprivation. <i>They had famished the city into surrender.</i>
humidity	Wetness in the atmosphere. <i>The humidity should be supplied by regularly spraying the leaves.</i>
moisturize	Make (more) humid. <i>Revitalize your face moisturize your skin.</i>
parch	Cause to wither or parch from exposure to heat. <i>A piece of grassland parched by the sun.</i>

parched	Toasted or roasted slightly. <i>I m parched I ll die without a drink.</i>
precipitation	The process of forming a chemical precipitate. <i>He is responsible for the precipitation of his own demise.</i>
scorch	A plant disease that produces a browning or scorched appearance of plant tissues. <i>The meat had scorched.</i>
sear	Burn or scorch the surface of (something) with a sudden, intense heat. <i>When summer sears the plains.</i>
semiarid	Somewhat arid. <i>A semiarid region with little annual rainfall.</i>
shrivel	Wither, as with a loss of moisture. <i>The flowers simply shrivelled up.</i>
singe	Be lightly or superficially burned. <i>My eyebrows singed when I bent over the flames.</i>
thirst	A physiological need to drink. <i>They quenched their thirst with spring water.</i>
withered	(of a part of the body) shrunken or wrinkled from age or disease. <i>A lanky scarecrow of a man with withered face and lantern jaws.</i>
