- *The sound of a liquid falling drop by drop.*
- *Flowing in drops; the formation and falling of drops of liquid.*
- *Fat that has melted and dripped from roasting meat, used in cooking or eaten cold as a spread.*
- *A projection from a cornice or sill designed to protect the area below from rainwater (as over a window or doorway).*

- Wax, fat, or other liquid produced from something by the effect of heat.

**animal fat** A living organism characterized by voluntary movement.

**cooking oil** The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat.

**drip** A method of brewing coffee by dripping boiling water through a filter filled with ground coffee beans.

- doughy** (of a person) pale and rather fat.  
*A pasty **doughy** chubby white kid from the suburbs.*
- mushy** Having the consistency of mush.  
***Mushy** vegetables.*
- oozy** Leaking out slowly.
- pulpy** Like a pulp or overripe; not having stiffness.  
*Simmer gently until the fruit is very soft and **pulpy**.*
- sloppy** Careless and unsystematic; excessively casual.  
*She wore a **sloppy** sweater and jeans.*
- slushy** Being or resembling melting snow.  
***Slushy** snow.*
- soft and wet** Yielding readily to pressure or weight.



**squashy**

Easily crushed or squeezed into a different shape; having a soft consistency.  
*A big **squashy** leather chair.*

**squishy**

Easily squashed; resembling a sponge in having soft porous texture and compressibility.  
*The road is a sluice of **squishy** mud.*

## Associations of "Dripping" (30 Words)

- beck** A beckoning gesture.
- cascade** Rush down in big quantities like a cascade.  
*Separation of isotopes by a **cascade** of processes.*
- coffee** The shrub which yields coffee seeds native to the Old World tropics.  
*A **coffee** pot.*
- disgorge** Pour (something) out.  
*The wine is aged in the bottle before it is **disgorged**.*
- dive** A sudden marked fall in prices or profits.  
*I was afraid to **dive** from the board into the pool.*
- dribble** (in soccer, hockey, and basketball) take (the ball) forwards past opponents with slight touches of the feet or the stick, or (in basketball) by continuous bouncing.  
*He attempted to **dribble** the ball from the goal area.*
- drivel** Let saliva drivel from the mouth.  
*Don't talk such **drivel**.*
- drop** An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute.  
*There was not a **drop** of water in sight.*

<b>fall</b>	Go as if by falling. <i>There is a <b>fall</b> of woodcock in the round wood above the dell.</i>
<b>filter</b>	Remove by passing through a filter. <i>An oil <b>filter</b>.</i>
<b>flow</b>	The amount of fluid that flows in a given time. <i>Ventilation channels keep the air <b>flowing</b>.</i>
<b>glen</b>	A narrow secluded valley (in the mountains.
<b>gorge</b>	The crop of a hawk. <i>They <b>gorged</b> themselves on Cornish cream teas.</i>
<b>immerse</b>	Cause to be immersed. <i>She <b>immersed</b> herself in her work.</i>
<b>percolator</b>	A coffeepot in which boiling water ascends through a central tube and filters back down through a basket of ground coffee beans.
<b><u>plummet</u></b>	Drop sharply. <i>A climber was killed when he <b>plummeted</b> 300 feet down an icy gully.</i>
<b><u>plunge</u></b>	Quickly immerse in liquid. <i>The stock market <b>plunged</b>.</i>
<b>purl</b>	Knit with a purl stitch. <i>Knit one <b>purl</b> one.</i>
<b>ravine</b>	A deep narrow steep-sided valley (especially one formed by running water.
<b>retch</b>	Make the sound and movement of vomiting. <i>With a sudden <b>retch</b> he vomited all over the floor.</i>
<b>saliva</b>	A clear liquid secreted into the mouth by the salivary glands and mucous glands of the mouth moistens the mouth and starts the digestion of starches.
<b><u>spew</u></b>	Vomit. <i>He felt faint and nauseous he had to get out before he <b>spewed</b>.</i>
<b><u>spill</u></b>	A quantity of liquid that has spilled or been spilt. <i>He was absolved from any blame for the oil <b>spill</b>.</i>
<b>submerge</b>	Put under water. <i>Pellets were then <b>submersed</b> in agar.</i>
<b>submersion</b>	Sinking until covered completely with water. <i>Five small islands threatened by <b>submersion</b>.</i>
<b>swallow</b>	An amount of something swallowed in one action. <i>The huge waves <b>swallowed</b> the small boat and it sank shortly thereafter.</i>
<b>swimmer</b>	A person who travels through the water by swimming. <i>He is not a good <b>swimmer</b>.</i>



**trickle** A small flow of liquid.  
*Philip **trickled** a line of sauce on his fish fingers.*

**urinate** Eliminate urine.  
*The sick men **urinated** blood.*

**waterfall** A cascade of water falling from a height, formed when a river or stream flows over a precipice or steep incline.  
*Each phase of a **waterfall** project must be complete prior to moving to the next phase.*
