Driver as a Noun

Definitions of "Driver" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “driver” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A program that determines how a computer will communicate with a peripheral device.*
- *A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver.*
- *A person who drives a vehicle.*
- *Someone who drives animals that pull a vehicle.*
- *The operator of a motor vehicle.*
- *A program that controls the operation of a device such as a printer or scanner.*
- *A person who drives a specified kind of animal.*
- *A wheel or other part in a mechanism that receives power directly and transmits motion to other parts.*
- *A device or part of a circuit that provides power for output.*
- *A golf club with a flat face and wooden head, used for driving from the tee.*
- *A golf club (a wood) with a near vertical face that is used for hitting long shots from the tee.*
- *(computer science) a program that determines how a computer will communicate with a peripheral device.*
- *A factor which causes a particular phenomenon to happen or develop.*



Synonyms of "Driver" as a noun (3 Words)

- device driver** An instrumentality invented for a particular purpose.
- motorist** The driver of a car.
- number one wood** The property possessed by a sum or total or indefinite quantity of units or individuals.

ambulance	Convey in an ambulance. <i>He was taken by ambulance to the district hospital.</i>
automobile	Travel in an automobile.
axle	A shaft on which a wheel rotates. <i>North American railways operate cars at much higher axle loads.</i>
bicycle	Ride a bicycle. <i>They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.</i>
bus	The topology of a network whose components are connected by a busbar. <i>He always rode the bus to work.</i>
cab	Ride in a taxicab. <i>She hailed a cab.</i>
car	A railway carriage. <i>Three cars had jumped the rails.</i>

<u>chauffeur</u>	Drive (a car or a passenger in a car), typically as part of one's job. <i>A chauffeur driven limousine.</i>
crane	Move a heavy object with a crane. <i>A very long tracking shot done with dolly and crane.</i>
cyclist	A person who rides a bicycle.
<u>distraction</u>	A diversion or recreation. <i>The firm found passenger travel a distraction from the main business of moving freight.</i>
<u>drive</u>	Have certain properties when driven. <i>Some people are driven to murder their tormentors.</i>
jalopy	An old car in a dilapidated condition. <i>His father got worried about him driving that old jalopy it wasn't safe.</i>
licence	Freedom to behave as one wishes, especially in a way which results in excessive or unacceptable behaviour. <i>A gun licence.</i>
limousine	A passenger vehicle carrying people to and from an airport. <i>The Prince was whisked away in a black limousine.</i>
machinist	A craftsman skilled in operating machine tools.
motorist	Someone who drives (or travels in) an automobile.
pantehnicon	A large van for transporting furniture.
parking	Space in which vehicles can be parked. <i>There is plenty of parking behind the store.</i>
pedal	Move a bicycle by working its pedals. <i>He was coming down the path on his bike pedalling hard.</i>
pickup	An electro-acoustic transducer that is the part of the arm of a record player that holds the needle and that is removable. <i>This microphone helps reduce the pickup of background noise.</i>
<u>ride</u>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. <i>Did you ever ride a camel.</i>
streetcar	A wheeled vehicle that runs on rails and is propelled by electricity.
taxi	Of a pilot cause an aircraft to taxi. <i>The plane taxied down the runway.</i>
tram	Travel by tram. <i>A tramcar carries coal out of a coal mine.</i>
<u>truck</u>	Convey by truck. <i>Private contractors were trucking for Denali.</i>
trucker	Someone who drives a truck as an occupation.

A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.

van

A caravan.

vehicle

A conveyance that transports people or objects.
