- *A program that determines how a computer will communicate with a peripheral device.*
- *A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver.*
- *A person who drives a vehicle.*
- *Someone who drives animals that pull a vehicle.*
- *The operator of a motor vehicle.*
- *A program that controls the operation of a device such as a printer or scanner.*
- *A person who drives a specified kind of animal.*
- *A wheel or other part in a mechanism that receives power directly and transmits motion to other parts.*
- *A device or part of a circuit that provides power for output.*
- *A golf club with a flat face and wooden head, used for driving from the tee.*
- *A golf club (a wood) with a near vertical face that is used for hitting long shots from the tee.*
- *(computer science) a program that determines how a computer will communicate with a peripheral device.*
- *A factor which causes a particular phenomenon to happen or develop.*



### **Synonyms of "Driver" as a noun (3 Words)**

- device driver**      An instrumentality invented for a particular purpose.
- motorist**            The driver of a car.
- number one wood**    The property possessed by a sum or total or indefinite quantity of units or individuals.

<b><a href="#">ambulance</a></b>	Convey in an ambulance. <i>He was taken by <b>ambulance</b> to the district hospital.</i>
<b>automobile</b>	Travel in an automobile.
<b>axle</b>	A shaft on which a wheel rotates. <i>North American railways operate cars at much higher <b>axle</b> loads.</i>
<b>bicycle</b>	Ride a bicycle. <i>They spent the holidays bicycling around the beautiful Devonshire countryside.</i>
<b>bus</b>	The topology of a network whose components are connected by a busbar. <i>He always rode the <b>bus</b> to work.</i>
<b>cab</b>	Ride in a taxicab. <i>She hailed a <b>cab</b>.</i>
<b>car</b>	A railway carriage. <i>Three <b>cars</b> had jumped the rails.</i>

<b><u>chauffeur</u></b>	Drive (a car or a passenger in a car), typically as part of one's job. <i>A <b>chauffeur</b> driven limousine.</i>
<b>crane</b>	Move a heavy object with a crane. <i>A very long tracking shot done with dolly and <b>crane</b>.</i>
<b>cyclist</b>	A person who rides a bicycle.
<b><u>distraction</u></b>	A diversion or recreation. <i>The firm found passenger travel a <b>distraction</b> from the main business of moving freight.</i>
<b><u>drive</u></b>	Have certain properties when driven. <i>Some people are <b>driven</b> to murder their tormentors.</i>
<b>jalopy</b>	An old car in a dilapidated condition. <i>His father got worried about him driving that old <b>jalopy</b> it wasn't safe.</i>
<b>licence</b>	Freedom to behave as one wishes, especially in a way which results in excessive or unacceptable behaviour. <i>A gun <b>licence</b>.</i>
<b>limousine</b>	A passenger vehicle carrying people to and from an airport. <i>The Prince was whisked away in a black <b>limousine</b>.</i>
<b>machinist</b>	A craftsman skilled in operating machine tools.
<b>motorist</b>	Someone who drives (or travels in) an automobile.
<b>pantehnicon</b>	A large van for transporting furniture.
<b>parking</b>	Space in which vehicles can be parked. <i>There is plenty of <b>parking</b> behind the store.</i>
<b>pedal</b>	Move a bicycle by working its pedals. <i>He was coming down the path on his bike <b>pedalling</b> hard.</i>
<b>pickup</b>	An electro-acoustic transducer that is the part of the arm of a record player that holds the needle and that is removable. <i>This microphone helps reduce the <b>pickup</b> of background noise.</i>
<b><u>ride</u></b>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. <i>Did you ever <b>ride</b> a camel.</i>
<b>streetcar</b>	A wheeled vehicle that runs on rails and is propelled by electricity.
<b>taxi</b>	Of a pilot cause an aircraft to taxi. <i>The plane <b>taxied</b> down the runway.</i>
<b>tram</b>	Travel by tram. <i>A <b>tramcar</b> carries coal out of a coal mine.</i>
<b><u>truck</u></b>	Convey by truck. <i>Private contractors were <b>trucking</b> for Denali.</i>
<b>trucker</b>	Someone who drives a truck as an occupation.
