- A program that determines how a computer will communicate with a peripheral device.
- A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver.
- A person who drives a vehicle.
- Someone who drives animals that pull a vehicle.
- The operator of a motor vehicle.
- A program that controls the operation of a device such as a printer or scanner.
- A person who drives a specified kind of animal.
- A wheel or other part in a mechanism that receives power directly and transmits motion to other parts.
- A device or part of a circuit that provides power for output.
- A golf club with a flat face and wooden head, used for driving from the tee.
- A golf club (a wood) with a near vertical face that is used for hitting long shots from the tee.
- (computer science) a program that determines how a computer will communicate with a peripheral device.
- A factor which causes a particular phenomenon to happen or develop.

number one wood The property possessed by a sum or total or indefinite quantity of units or individuals.

jalopy An old car in a dilapidated condition.

His father got worried about him driving that old **jalopy** it wasn t safe.

Freedom to behave as one wishes, especially in a way which results in

licence excessive or unacceptable behaviour.

A gun **licence**.

A passenger vehicle carrying people to and from an airport.

The Prince was whisked away in a black limousine.

machinist A craftsman skilled in operating machine tools.motorist Someone who drives (or travels in) an automobile.

pantechnicon A large van for transporting furniture.

parking Space in which vehicles can be parked.

There is plenty of **parking** behind the store.

pedal Move a bicycle by working its pedals.

He was coming down the path on his bike **pedal**ling hard.

An electro-acoustic transducer that is the part of the arm of a record player

pickup that holds the needle and that is removable.

This microphone helps reduce the **pickup** of background noise.

A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement.

Did you ever **ride** a camel.

streetcar A wheeled vehicle that runs on rails and is propelled by electricity.

taxi Of a pilot cause an aircraft to taxi.

The plane **taxi**ed down the runway.

tram Travel by tram.

A tramcar carries coal out of a coal mine.

truck Convey by truck.

Private contractors were **truck**ing for Denali.

trucker Someone who drives a truck as an occupation.
