### **Definitions of "Dropping" as an adjective**

**falling** Becoming lower or less in degree or value.  
***Falling*** temperatures.

## Associations of "Dropping" (30 Words)

<b><u>abate</u></b>	Become less in amount or intensity. <i>The storm suddenly <b>abated</b>.</i>
<b>awash</b>	Covered with water. <i>The main deck was afloat or <b>awash</b>.</i>
<b><u>cascade</u></b>	Rush down in big quantities like a cascade. <i>Blonde hair <b>cascaded</b> down her back.</i>
<b>declension</b>	The class to which a noun or adjective is assigned according to the manner of this variation. <i>The <b>declension</b> of the new generation.</i>
<b>decline</b>	Inflect for number, gender, case, etc. <i>The company <b>declined</b> to comment.</i>
<b>declivity</b>	A downward slope or bend. <i>A thickly wooded <b>declivity</b>.</i>

<b>descend</b>	(of a situation or group of people) reach (an undesirable state). <i>He was scrupulous in refusing to <b>descend</b> to misrepresentation.</i>
<b><u>diminution</u></b>	The act of decreasing or reducing something. <i>A permanent <b>diminution</b> in value.</i>
<b>dip</b>	A candle that is made by repeated dipping in a pool of wax or tallow. <i>The road <b>dipped</b> down to the bridge.</i>
<b><u>dive</u></b>	A sudden movement in a specified direction. <i>An 11 per cent <b>dive</b> in profits.</i>
<b><u>down</u></b>	Drink down entirely. <i><b>Down</b> by a pawn.</i>
<b><u>downturn</u></b>	A decline in economic, business, or other activity. <i>A <b>downturn</b> in the housing market.</i>
<b><u>dribble</u></b>	Let saliva drivel from the mouth. <i>He <b>dribbled</b> cream into his coffee.</i>
<b><u>drip</u></b>	A method of brewing coffee by dripping boiling water through a filter filled with ground coffee beans. <i>He had been on a <b>drip</b> for several days.</i>
<b>drivel</b>	Let saliva drivel from the mouth. <i>Don't talk such <b>drivel</b>.</i>
<b><u>engulf</u></b>	Flow over or cover completely. <i>Europe might be <b>engulfed</b> by war.</i>
<b>fall</b>	Fall from clouds. <i>The barometer is <b>falling</b>.</i>
<b><u>falling</u></b>	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i><b>Falling</b> attendance figures.</i>
<b>immerse</b>	Cause to be immersed. <i><b>Immerse</b> the paper in water for twenty minutes.</i>
<b>parachute</b>	Jump from an airplane and descend with a parachute. <i>An air operation to <b>parachute</b> relief supplies into the region.</i>
<b><u>plummet</u></b>	Drop sharply. <i>The bird has a circular display flight followed by an earthward <b>plummet</b>.</i>
<b><u>plunge</u></b>	Dash violently or with great speed or impetuosity. <i>The stock market <b>plunged</b>.</i>
<b>sink</b>	Cause to sink. <i>They planned to <b>sink</b> a gold mine in Oklahoma.</i>
<b>slump</b>	Go down in value. <i>United <b>slumped</b> to another one nil defeat.</i>

- submerge** Put under water.  
*Houses had been flooded and cars **submerged**.*
- submergence** The process or state of being submerged in or covered with water.  
*Total **submergence** of plants results in heavy crop losses.*
- submerse** Put under water.  
*Pellets were then **submersed** in agar.*
- subside** (of a building or other structure) sink lower into the ground.  
*Patrick **subsided** into his seat.*
- trickle** Flowing in drops; the formation and falling of drops of liquid.  
*A solitary tear **trickled** down her cheek.*
- waterfall** Relating to or denoting a method of project management that is characterized by sequential stages and a fixed plan of work.  
*Each phase of a **waterfall** project must be complete prior to moving to the next phase.*
