down Drink down entirely.

Down by a pawn.

downturn A decline in economic, business, or other activity.

A downturn in the housing market.

dribble Let saliva drivel from the mouth.

He dribbled cream into his coffee.

A method of brewing coffee by dripping boiling water through a filter filled

drip with ground coffee beans.

He had been on a **drip** for several days.

drivel Let saliva drivel from the mouth.

Don t talk such **drivel**.

engulf Flow over or cover completely.

Europe might be **engulf**ed by war.

fall Fall from clouds.

The barometer is **fall**ing.

falling Coming down freely under the influence of gravity.

Falling attendance figures.

immerse Cause to be immersed.

Immerse the paper in water for twenty minutes.

parachute Jump from an airplane and descend with a parachute.

An air operation to **parachute** relief supplies into the region.

Drop sharply.

plummetThe bird has a circular display flight followed by an earthward **plummet**.

Dash violently or with great speed or impetuosity.

plungeThe stock market **plunge**d.

sink Cause to sink.

They planned to **sink** a gold mine in Oklahoma.

Go down in value.

United **slump**ed to another one nil defeat.



submerge Put under water.

Houses had been flooded and cars **submerge**d.

submergence The process or state of being submerged in or covered with water.

Total **submergence** of plants results in heavy crop losses.

submerse Put under water.

Pellets were then **submerse**d in agar.

subside (of a building or other structure) sink lower into the ground.

Patrick **subside**d into his seat.

trickle Flowing in drops; the formation and falling of drops of liquid.

A solitary tear **trickle**d down her cheek.

Relating to or denoting a method of project management that is

characterized by sequential stages and a fixed plan of work.
