Associations of "Drying" (30 Words)

anhydrous	(of a substance, especially a crystalline compound) containing no water.
arid	Lacking vitality or spirit; lifeless-C.J.Rolo. <i>The arid plains north of Cape Town.</i>
aridity	A deficiency of moisture (especially when resulting from a permanent absence of rainfall).
blacken	Damage or destroy (someone’s reputation) by speaking badly of them. <i>Stone blackened by the soot of ages.</i>
char	Burn to charcoal. <i>The char will clean the carpet.</i>
climatic	Of or relating to a climate. <i>Under certain climatic conditions desert locusts increase in number.</i>
dehydrate	Lose water or moisture. <i>In the desert you get dehydrated very quickly.</i>
desert	Desert a cause a country or an army often in order to join the opposing cause country or army. <i>We feel our public representatives have deserted us.</i>
desiccant	A hygroscopic substance used as a drying agent. <i>Natural desiccants cause fleas to dehydrate and die.</i>
desiccate	Preserve by removing all water and liquids from. <i>Years of drought have desiccated the soil.</i>
desiccated	Lacking vitality or spirit; lifeless. <i>Shredded and desiccated coconut meat.</i>
desiccation	Dryness resulting from the removal of water. <i>Long periods of drought have led to the desiccation of farming land.</i>
dried	Preserved by removal or evaporation of moisture. <i>The ink has dried.</i>

drought	A shortage of rainfall. <i>Farmers most affected by the drought hope that there may yet be sufficient rain early in the growing season.</i>
dryness	Lack of interest, excitement, or embellishment; dullness. <i>Dryness of the mouth may occur while you are taking this medicine.</i>
evaporate	Lose or cause to lose liquid by vaporization leaving a more concentrated residue. <i>Evaporate milk.</i>
evaporation	The process of something abstract ceasing to exist. <i>Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid evaporation of their retirement plans.</i>
famish	Deprive of food. <i>They had famished the city into surrender.</i>
humidity	A quantity representing the amount of water vapour in the atmosphere or in a gas. <i>The temperature is seventy seven the humidity in the low thirties.</i>
moisturize	Make (more) humid. <i>Revitalize your face moisturize your skin.</i>
parch	Cause to wither or parch from exposure to heat. <i>A piece of grassland parched by the sun.</i>
parched	Dried out with heat. <i>Parched corn.</i>
precipitation	An unexpected acceleration or hastening. <i>These convective processes produce cloud and precipitation.</i>
scorch	Become scorched or singed under intense heat or dry conditions. <i>The invaders scorched the land.</i>
sear	Become superficially burned. <i>The unfortunate childhood encounter is seared on his memory.</i>
semiarid	Somewhat arid. <i>A semiarid region with little annual rainfall.</i>
shrivel	Decrease in size, range, or extent. <i>She shrivelled him with one glance.</i>
singe	A superficial burn. <i>The fire had singed his eyebrows.</i>
thirst	A feeling of needing or wanting to drink something. <i>A thirst for knowledge.</i>

withered

(used especially of vegetation) having lost all moisture.
*He did well despite his **withered** arm.*
