## Associations of "Drying" (30 Words)

anhydrous	(of a substance, especially a crystalline compound) containing no water.
<u>arid</u>	Lacking vitality or spirit; lifeless-C.J.Rolo. The <b>arid</b> plains north of Cape Town.
<u>aridity</u>	A deficiency of moisture (especially when resulting from a permanent absence of rainfall.
blacken	Damage or destroy (someone's reputation) by speaking badly of them. Stone <b>blacken</b> ed by the soot of ages.
char	Burn to charcoal. The <b>char</b> will clean the carpet.
climatic	Of or relating to a climate. Under certain <b>climatic</b> conditions desert locusts increase in number.
dehydrate	Lose water or moisture. In the desert you get <b>dehydrate</b> d very quickly.
<u>desert</u>	Desert a cause a country or an army often in order to join the opposing cause country or army. We feel our public representatives have <b>desert</b> ed us.
desiccant	A hygroscopic substance used as a drying agent. Natural <b>desiccant</b> s cause fleas to dehydrate and die.
desiccate	Preserve by removing all water and liquids from. Years of drought have <b>desiccate</b> d the soil.
desiccated	Lacking vitality or spirit; lifeless. Shredded and <b>desiccated</b> coconut meat.
desiccation	Dryness resulting from the removal of water. Long periods of drought have led to the <b>desiccation</b> of farming land.
dried	Preserved by removal or evaporation of moisture. The ink has <b>dried</b> .



A shortage of rainfall. Farmers most affected by the <b>drought</b> hope that there may yet be sufficient rain early in the growing season.
Lack of interest, excitement, or embellishment; dullness. <b>Dryness</b> of the mouth may occur while you are taking this medicine.
Lose or cause to lose liquid by vaporization leaving a more concentrated residue. <i>Evaporate</i> milk.
The process of something abstract ceasing to exist. Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid <b>evaporation</b> of their retirement plans.
Deprive of food. They had <b>famish</b> ed the city into surrender.
A quantity representing the amount of water vapour in the atmosphere or in a gas. The temperature is seventy seven the <b>humidity</b> in the low thirties.
Make (more) humid. Revitalize your face <b>moisturize</b> your skin.
Cause to wither or parch from exposure to heat. A piece of grassland <b>parch</b> ed by the sun.
Dried out with heat. <b>Parched</b> corn.
An unexpected acceleration or hastening. These convective processes produce cloud and <b>precipitation</b> .
Become scorched or singed under intense heat or dry conditions. The invaders <b>scorch</b> ed the land.
Become superficially burned. The unfortunate childhood encounter is <b>sear</b> ed on his memory.
Somewhat arid. A <b>semiarid</b> region with little annual rainfall.
Decrease in size, range, or extent. She <b>shrivel</b> led him with one glance.
A superficial burn. The fire had <b>singe</b> d his eyebrows.
A feeling of needing or wanting to drink something. A <b>thirst</b> for knowledge.



## withered (used especially of vegetation) having lost all moisture. He did well despite his withered arm.
