Associations of "Dumb down" (30 Words)

crass	(of persons) so unrefined as to be lacking in discrimination and sensibility. <i>The crass assumptions that men make about women.</i>
declension	A condition of decline or moral deterioration. <i>The declension of the new generation.</i>
descend	Do something that one considers to be below one's dignity. <i>Three hotels were granted the prestigious five star status whilst others descended in quality or maintained their ranking.</i>
descending	Coming down or downward. <i>The categories are listed in descending order of usefulness.</i>
descent	An unexpected visit. <i>The settlers were of Cornish descent.</i>
drop	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>He dropped his voice as she came into the room.</i>
falling	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i>Falling standards.</i>
folly	A costly ornamental building with no practical purpose, especially a tower or mock-Gothic ruin built in a large garden or park. <i>An act of sheer folly.</i>
fool	Foolish silly. <i>She had been fooling herself in thinking she could remain indifferent.</i>
foolery	Silly or foolish behaviour. <i>We endured his foolery all afternoon.</i>
foolhardy	Marked by defiant disregard for danger or consequences. <i>It would be foolhardy to go into the scheme without support.</i>
hubris	(in Greek tragedy) excessive pride towards or defiance of the gods, leading to nemesis. <i>The self assured hubris among economists was shaken in the late 1980s.</i>

idiot	A person of subnormal intelligence.
ignorance	The lack of knowledge or education. <i>He acted in ignorance of basic procedures.</i>
ignorant	Uneducated in general; lacking knowledge or sophistication. <i>This ignorant pin brained receptionist.</i>
imbecility	A stupid mistake.
insanity	Relatively permanent disorder of the mind. <i>He suffered from bouts of insanity.</i>
low	Of a river or lake below the usual water level. <i>His popularity ratings are at an all time low.</i>
lunacy	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of lunacy.</i>
patsy	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. <i>There is a mischievous sparkle in his eyes that suggests he is no patsy.</i>
shiftless	Lacking or characterized by lack of ambition or initiative; lazy. <i>A shiftless lot of good for nothings.</i>
silly	Helpless; defenceless (typically used of a woman, child, or animal). <i>Silly mid on.</i>
simpleton	A foolish or gullible person. <i>Stop grinning at me like a simpleton.</i>
sink	Cause a ship to sink. <i>The players were sinking a few post match lagers.</i>
stupidity	A stupid mistake. <i>A comedy of infantile stupidity.</i>
sucker	Of a plant produce suckers. <i>It spread rapidly after being left undisturbed to sucker.</i>
under	Under water. <i>He was floating for some time but suddenly went under.</i>
vacuity	The absence of matter. <i>He denounced what he considered the frivolity or vacuity of much contemporary painting.</i>
