stout	Dependable. <i>Stout hearts.</i>
strong	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>The competition was too strong.</i>
sturdy	Strong enough to withstand rough work or treatment. <i>The bike is sturdy enough to cope with bumpy tracks.</i>
substantial	Of or relating to the real nature or essential elements of something. <i>A substantial family.</i>
tough	Physically toughened. <i>Poor kid It s tough on her.</i>
undestroyable	Not capable of being destroyed.
well made	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

indelible	Cannot be removed or erased. <i>The story made an indelible impression on me.</i>
indestructible	Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible plastic containers.</i>
ineradicable	Not able to be destroyed or rooted out. <i>Ineradicable hostility.</i>
invariable	Not liable to or capable of change. <i>His routine was invariable.</i>
lasting	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long lasting friendship.</i>
permanence	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i>
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
permanent	A perm for the hair. <i>Literature of permanent value.</i>

- unchangeable** Not liable to variation or able to be altered.
*A fixed and **unchangeable** part of the germ plasm.*
- unchanging** Not changing; remaining the same.
*The party stood for **unchanging** principles.*
- unwavering** Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable.
*She fixed him with an **unwavering** stare.*
