befouled	Made dirty or foul. <i>A building befouled with soot.</i>
begrimed	Blackened with ingrained dirt. <i>A miner's begrimed face.</i>
chalky	Consisting of or rich in chalk. <i>Walls of chalky green.</i>
cold	Extended meanings especially of psychological coldness without human warmth or emotion. <i>The trail went cold.</i>
crumbly	Consisting of or easily breaking into small fragments. <i>The cheese has a sharp flavour and is crumbly and moist.</i>
dull	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>Your diet doesn't have to be dull and boring.</i>
dust-covered	Covered with a layer of dust.

faded	Reduced in strength. <i>Faded jeans.</i>
flat	Relating to flat racing. <i>The UK housing market was flat.</i>
friable	Easily crumbled. <i>Friable curds formed in the stomach.</i>
grimy	Thickly covered with ingrained dirt or soot. <i>The grimy industrial city.</i>
grubby	Involving dishonest or disreputable activity; sordid. <i>The grubby face of a young boy.</i>
moth-eaten	Showing signs of wear and tear.
mucky	(of soil) soft and watery. <i>Wet mucky lowland.</i>
muted	In a softened tone. <i>A dress in muted tones of powder blue and dusty pink.</i>
pale	Very light colored; highly diluted with white. <i>The pale light of a half moon.</i>
pastel	Of a soft and delicate shade of colour. <i>Faded pastel charms of the naive music.</i>
powdery	As if dulled in color with a sprinkling of powder. <i>A powdery blue.</i>
restrained	Kept under control. <i>The drawings with their restrained colours give a feeling of peace and contemplation.</i>
soiled	Soiled or likely to soil with dirt or grime. <i>A soiled T shirt.</i>
sooty	Used in names of birds and other animals that are mainly blackish or brownish black e.g sooty tern. <i>A sooty chimney.</i>
spotty	Having spots or patches (small areas of contrasting color or texture). <i>The wall had a spotty speckled effect.</i>
stained	Having a coating of stain or varnish. <i>Her ink stained fingers.</i>
stale	(of food) no longer fresh and pleasant to eat; hard, musty, or dry. <i>Stale news.</i>
subtle	Difficult to detect or grasp by the mind or analyze. <i>The subtle fiend dissembled.</i>

unclean Soiled or likely to soil with dirt or grime.
Wore an **unclean** shirt.

bog

An area of wet muddy ground that is too soft to support a heavy body.
A **bog** of legal complications.

climate

A region with a particular climate.
He had grown up in a hot **climate**.

cold

Extended meanings especially of psychological coldness without human warmth or emotion.
Cold logic.

covered

Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form.
Covered wagons.

damp

Damp air or atmosphere.
An ensemble of drums including a foot **damped** instrument.

dank	Unpleasantly cool and humid. <i>Huge dank caverns.</i>
drenched	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i>Moon drenched meadows.</i>
grimy	Thickly covered with ingrained dirt or soot. <i>The grimy industrial city.</i>
humid	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>A hot and humid day.</i>
marshland	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Acres of meadows and marshlands.</i>
marshy	Characteristic of or resembling a marsh; waterlogged. <i>A marshy coastline.</i>
moist	(of a climate) rainy. <i>The moist fertile soil.</i>
muddy	Cause to become muddy. <i>The original colours were blurred into muddy pink and yellow.</i>
mudslide	A mass of mud and other earthy material that is falling or has fallen down a hillside or other slope.
muffled	Wrapped up especially for protection or secrecy. <i>They heard the sounds of muffled voices.</i>
muted	Being or made softer or less loud or clear. <i>The muted hum of the distant traffic.</i>
rain	Falls of rain. <i>The low sky raining over tower d Camelot.</i>
rainy	(of weather, a period, or an area) having or characterized by considerable rainfall. <i>Rainy days.</i>
scabrous	Rough and covered with, or as if with, scabs. <i>A scabrous hovel.</i>
snow	Fall as snow. <i>Carbon dioxide snow.</i>
snowy	Marked by the presence of snow. <i>Snowy hair.</i>
soggy	Slow and apathetic. <i>We squelched through the soggy ground.</i>
splashing	The act of splashing a liquid substance on a surface.

- swamp** Low land that is seasonally flooded; has more woody plants than a marsh and better drainage than a bog.
*The country was **swamped** with goods from abroad.*
- swampy** (of soil) soft and watery.
*A **swampy** area.*
- tropics** The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
- unclean** Having a physical or moral blemish so as to make impure according to dietary or ceremonial laws.
***Unclean** thoughts.*
- unsanitary** Not sanitary or healthful.
*The **unsanitary** conditions in the orphanage.*
- wet** Make one's bed or clothes wet by urinating.
*He **wetted** a finger and flicked through the pages.*
