ancestryThe evolutionary or genetic line of descent of an animal or plant.<br/>The ancestry of the rose is extremely complicated.bloodlineA set of ancestors or line of descent of an important person.<br/>The survival of a legitimate royal bloodline.descentA downward slope.<br/>The plane had gone into a steep descent.



<u>extraction</u>	The action of extracting something, especially using effort or force. <i>Mineral extraction</i> .
family	A person having kinship with another or others. <i>He wanted to have a good job before starting a <b>family</b>.</i>
family tree	People descended from a common ancestor.
genealogy	A line of descent traced continuously from an ancestor. <i>The genealogies of the kings of Mercia.</i>
house	The people living in a house a household. <i>He counted the <b>house</b></i> .
line	In football hockey etc the goal line. A good position at the start <b>line</b> will put you in the front rank on the first leg.
<u>lineage</u>	A rate of payment for written material that is measured according to the number of lines submitted. <i>The chimpanzee and gorilla lineages.</i>
succession	The gradual and orderly process of change in an ecosystem brought about by the progressive replacement of one community by another until a stable climax is established. A <b>succession</b> of failures.

# Associations of "Dynasty" (30 Words)

baton	One of the suits in some tarot packs, corresponding to wands in others. <i>Batons of cheddar cheese.</i>
byzantine	Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious.



<u>crown</u>	Ceremonially place a crown on the head of someone in order to invest them as a monarch. Shiny covers embossed with gold <b>crown</b> s.
diadem	An ornamental jeweled headdress signifying sovereignty. <i>He refused the <b>diadem</b> of all the Caesars.</i>
<u>emperor</u>	The male ruler of an empire. <i>He became <b>emperor</b> in 1930.</i>
<u>empire</u>	A group of diverse companies under common ownership and run as a single organization. Her business <b>empire</b> grew.
imperial	Imperious or domineering. <i>The <b>imperial</b> family.</i>
incan	Of or pertaining to the Incas or their culture or empire.
<u>king</u>	Make someone king. The <b>king</b> of rock.
<u>kingdom</u>	A basic group of natural objects. The <b>kingdom</b> of dreams.
liege	A feudal superior or sovereign. The Scots obeyed him as their <b>liege</b> lord.
lord	Make a lord of someone. When we were at school you used to <b>lord</b> it over us.
<u>majesty</u>	Used in the title of several state institutions. The <b>majesty</b> of Ben Nevis.
monarchy	An autocracy governed by a monarch who usually inherits the authority. The <b>monarchy</b> is the focus of loyalty and service.
<u>palace</u>	A large, splendid house or place of entertainment. The <b>palace</b> issued an order binding on all subjects.
prince	A man or thing regarded as pre-eminent in a particular sphere or group. He was the <b>prince</b> of a small kingdom that was now part of Pakistan.
princess	The wife or widow of a prince. <i>Is something the matter <b>princess</b>.</i>
principality	Wales.
queen	A playing card bearing a representation of a queen normally ranking next below a king and above a jack. <i>Her pawn queen</i> ed.



regal	Of, resembling, or fit for a monarch, especially in being magnificent or dignified. <i>Her <b>regal</b> bearing.</i>
regalia	The distinctive clothing worn and ornaments carried at formal occasions as an indication of status. The Bishop of Florence in full <b>regalia</b> .
regency	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a <b>regency</b>.</i>
regent	Acting as regent for a monarch. The queen <b>regent</b> of Portugal.
<u>royal</u>	A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast. <i>Treated with</i> <b>royal</b> acclaim.
<u>ruler</u>	Measuring stick consisting of a strip of wood or metal or plastic with a straight edge that is used for drawing straight lines and measuring lengths.
scepter	The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.
<u>sovereign</u>	(of political bodies) not controlled by outside forces. A <b>sovereign</b> state.
tyrannize	Rule or treat (someone) despotically or cruelly. <i>He <b>tyrannize</b>s over the servants.</i>
ukase	An edict of the Russian tsar. <i>Tsar Alexander I issued his famous</i> <b>ukase</b> <i>unilaterally decreeing the North</i> <i>Pacific Coast Russian territory.</i>
vassal	A holder of land by feudal tenure on conditions of homage and allegiance. A <b>vassal</b> state of the Ottoman Empire.
