Associations of "Dystopia" (30 Words)

accident	The working of fortune; chance. <i>If you are unable to work owing to accident or sickness.</i>
adversity	A state of misfortune or affliction. <i>Resilience in the face of adversity.</i>
aftermath	The consequences or after-effects of a significant unpleasant event. <i>The aftermath of war.</i>
aftershock	A smaller earthquake following the main shock of a large earthquake.
aid	A person or thing that is a resource that helps make something easier or possible to do. <i>Research was conducted to aid in making decisions.</i>
apocalyptic	Describing or prophesying the complete destruction of the world. <i>Apocalyptic imagery.</i>
befall	Happen, occur, or be the case in the course of events or by chance (Santayana). <i>He promised that no harm would befall her.</i>
beset	Annoy continually or chronically. <i>She was beset with self doubt.</i>
betide	Happen. <i>I waited with beating heart not knowing what would betide.</i>
blow	Spout moist air from the blowhole. <i>Cotton curtains were blowing in the breeze.</i>
calamity	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. <i>The whole city was affected by the irremediable calamity.</i>
cataclysm	An event resulting in great loss and misfortune. <i>The cataclysm at the end of the Cretaceous Period.</i>
cataclysmic	(of a natural event) large-scale and violent. <i>A cataclysmic earthquake.</i>

catastrophe	Something very unfortunate or unsuccessful. <i>Inaction will only bring us closer to catastrophe.</i>
disaster	An act that has disastrous consequences. <i>The earthquake was a disaster.</i>
earthquake	A disturbance that is extremely disruptive. <i>A political earthquake.</i>
harry	Persistently carry out attacks on (an enemy or an enemy's territory). <i>He is known to harry his staff when he is overworked.</i>
holocaust	Destruction or slaughter on a mass scale, especially caused by fire or nuclear war. <i>A nuclear holocaust.</i>
impending	Close in time; about to occur. <i>A fortune teller with dire warnings about impending doom.</i>
misadventure	An instance of misfortune. <i>The petty misdemeanours and misadventures of childhood.</i>
mischance	An unpredictable outcome that is unfortunate. <i>By pure mischance the secret was revealed.</i>
misfortune	Bad luck. <i>Never laugh at other people's misfortunes.</i>
paranoid	A person who is paranoid. <i>Paranoid schizophrenia.</i>
perturbation	An unhappy and worried mental state. <i>The term distress connotes some degree of perturbation and emotional upset.</i>
presage	A feeling of presentiment or foreboding. <i>Lands he could measure tides and tides presage.</i>
seismic	Subject to or caused by an earthquake or earth vibration. <i>There are seismic pressures threatening American society.</i>
shock	Subject to electrical shocks. <i>Her death gave us all a terrible shock.</i>
survival	An object or practice that has continued to exist from an earlier time. <i>His shorts were a survival from his army days.</i>
tragedy	A play dealing with tragic events and having an unhappy ending, especially one concerning the downfall of the main character. <i>A tragedy that killed 95 people.</i>
upheaval	A violent or sudden change or disruption to something. <i>The first upheaval produced a hill which was called Roof Mountain.</i>
