adversary	Someone who offers opposition. <i>The confrontations of adversary politics.</i>
also	In addition. <i>A brilliant linguist he was also interested in botany.</i>
another	Any of various alternatives; some other. <i>Put it off to another or some other day.</i>
antithesis	The juxtaposition of contrasting words or ideas to give a feeling of balance. <i>Figures of speech such as antithesis.</i>
antithetic	Sharply contrasted in character or purpose. <i>Hope is antithetic to despair.</i>
antithetical	Connected with, containing, or using the rhetorical device of antithesis. <i>People whose religious beliefs are antithetical to mine.</i>
both	(used with count nouns) two considered together; the two. <i>Studies of zebra finches both in the wild and in captivity.</i>
conflicting	In disagreement. <i>There are conflicting accounts of what occurred.</i>
contrarily	Contrary to expectations.
contrastingly	In a contrasting manner.
converse	Turned about in order or relation. <i>His converse at such seasons was always elevating.</i>
counterpart	A duplicate copy. <i>The minister held talks with his French counterpart.</i>
diametrical	Of or along a diameter. <i>He s the diametrical opposite of Gabriel.</i>
different	Differing from all others; not ordinary. <i>The car is different from anything else on the market.</i>

differently	In a novel and unusual way. <i>We work differently from other developers.</i>
<u>disparate</u>	Including markedly dissimilar elements. <i>They inhabit disparate worlds of thought.</i>
<u>dissimilar</u>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>A collection of dissimilar nations lacking overall homogeneity.</i>
<u>either</u>	After a negative statement used as an intensive meaning something like 'likewise' or 'also'.
etcetera	Additional unspecified odds and ends; more of the same. <i>His report was full of etceteras.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>
individually	One by one; singly; separately. <i>Individually wrapped cheeses.</i>
instead	In place of, or as an alternative to. <i>Felix became a herpetologist instead.</i>
opposite	Characterized by opposite extremes completely opposed. <i>And I on the opposite shore will be ready to ride and spread the alarm.</i>
<u>opposition</u>	The act of hostile groups opposing each other. <i>A nature culture opposition.</i>
<u>otherwise</u>	In a different state or situation. <i>All the staff were otherwise engaged.</i>
respectively	In the order given. <i>They received sentences of one year and eight months respectively.</i>
separately	Apart from others. <i>They arrived together but left separately.</i>
<u>unlike</u>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>They seemed utterly unlike despite being twins.</i>
unshared	Not shared with or by another or others. <i>Most of those placed in hostels would prefer unshared independent accommodation.</i>
<u>vary</u>	Change from one condition, form, or state to another. <i>His moods vary depending on the weather.</i>
