<b>anxiously</b>	With anxiety or apprehension. <i>We watched <b>anxiously</b>.</i>
<b>ardent</b>	Very enthusiastic or passionate. <i>The <b>ardent</b> flames.</i>
<b>aspire</b>	Direct one's hopes or ambitions towards achieving something. <i>Above the domes of loftiest mosques these pinnacles <b>aspire</b>.</i>
<b>await</b>	(of an event or circumstance) be in store for (someone). <i>An eagerly <b>awaited</b> debut.</i>

<b>bide</b>	Dwell. <i>How long must I <b>bide</b> here to wait for the answer.</i>
<b>covetous</b>	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>He was never <b>covetous</b> before he met her.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>A man of many <b>desires</b>.</i>
<b>desirous</b>	Having or characterized by desire. <i><b>Desirous</b> of finding a quick solution to the problem.</i>
<b>devour</b>	Eat immoderately. <i>He <b>devoured</b> half of his burger in one bite.</i>
<b>eager</b>	(of a person's expression or tone of voice) keenly expectant or interested. <i><b>Eager</b> to travel abroad.</i>
<b>earnest</b>	Sincerely earnest. <i>Two girls were in <b>earnest</b> conversation.</i>
<b>enthusiasm</b>	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Her energy and <b>enthusiasm</b> for life.</i>
<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>An <b>enthusiastic</b> response.</i>
<b>envious</b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>An <b>envious</b> glance.</i>
<b>fanaticism</b>	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious <b>fanaticism</b>.</i>
<b>fervent</b>	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>The <b>fervent</b> heat merely communicated a genial warmth to their half torpid systems.</i>
<b>fervid</b>	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. <i>His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.</i>
<b>greedy</b>	Ardently or excessively desirous. <i><b>Greedy</b> for money and power.</i>
<b>impassioned</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>An <b>impassioned</b> appeal.</i>
<b>jealous</b>	Feeling or showing a resentful suspicion that one's partner is attracted to or involved with someone else. <i>A <b>jealous</b> lover.</i>
<b>passion</b>	Any object of warm affection or devotion. <i>Oratory in which he gradually works himself up into a <b>passion</b>.</i>

<b>passionate</b>	Having or expressing strong emotions. <i><b>Passionate</b> pleas for help.</i>
<b><u>rabid</u></b>	Having or proceeding from an extreme or fanatical support of or belief in something. <i>She s expecting more <b>rabid</b> support from the home fans.</i>
<b>restlessly</b>	In a restless manner.
<b>torrid</b>	(especially in financial contexts) characterized by intense activity; hard to contain or stop. <i>The world s most <b>torrid</b> economies.</i>
<b>uneasily</b>	In a way that is awkward or incongruous. <i>I shifted <b>uneasily</b> in my seat.</i>
<b>zeal</b>	Prompt willingness. <i>He had an absolute <b>zeal</b> for litigation.</i>
<b>zealotry</b>	Fanatical and uncompromising pursuit of religious, political, or other ideals; fanaticism. <i>He expressed concern about religious <b>zealotry</b> playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
<b><u>zealous</u></b>	Having or showing zeal. <i>The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.</i>
