anxiously	With anxiety or apprehension. <i>We watched anxiously.</i>
ardent	Very enthusiastic or passionate. <i>The ardent flames.</i>
aspire	Direct one's hopes or ambitions towards achieving something. <i>Above the domes of loftiest mosques these pinnacles aspire.</i>
await	(of an event or circumstance) be in store for (someone). <i>An eagerly awaited debut.</i>

bide	Dwell. <i>How long must I bide here to wait for the answer.</i>
covetous	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>He was never covetous before he met her.</i>
desire	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>A man of many desires.</i>
desirous	Having or characterized by desire. <i>Desirous of finding a quick solution to the problem.</i>
devour	Eat immoderately. <i>He devoured half of his burger in one bite.</i>
eager	(of a person's expression or tone of voice) keenly expectant or interested. <i>Eager to travel abroad.</i>
earnest	Sincerely earnest. <i>Two girls were in earnest conversation.</i>
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Her energy and enthusiasm for life.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>An enthusiastic response.</i>
envious	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>An envious glance.</i>
fanaticism	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>The dangers of religious fanaticism.</i>
fervent	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>The fervent heat merely communicated a genial warmth to their half torpid systems.</i>
fervid	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. <i>His fervid protestations of love.</i>
greedy	Ardently or excessively desirous. <i>Greedy for money and power.</i>
impassioned	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>An impassioned appeal.</i>
jealous	Feeling or showing a resentful suspicion that one's partner is attracted to or involved with someone else. <i>A jealous lover.</i>
passion	Any object of warm affection or devotion. <i>Oratory in which he gradually works himself up into a passion.</i>

passionate	Having or expressing strong emotions. <i>Passionate pleas for help.</i>
<u>rabid</u>	Having or proceeding from an extreme or fanatical support of or belief in something. <i>She s expecting more rabid support from the home fans.</i>
restlessly	In a restless manner.
torrid	(especially in financial contexts) characterized by intense activity; hard to contain or stop. <i>The world s most torrid economies.</i>
uneasily	In a way that is awkward or incongruous. <i>I shifted uneasily in my seat.</i>
zeal	Prompt willingness. <i>He had an absolute zeal for litigation.</i>
zealotry	Fanatical and uncompromising pursuit of religious, political, or other ideals; fanaticism. <i>He expressed concern about religious zealotry playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
<u>zealous</u>	Having or showing zeal. <i>The council was extremely zealous in the application of the regulations.</i>
