acquire	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>I acquired a passing knowledge of Chinese.</i>
acquired	Gotten through environmental forces. <i>Acquired characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
allowance	Put on a fixed allowance as of food. <i>He objected to the allowance of smoking in the dining room.</i>
amnesty	A warrant granting release from punishment for an offense. <i>An amnesty for political prisoners.</i>
assets	Anything of material value or usefulness that is owned by a person or company.
college	The teaching staff and students of a college considered collectively. <i>Colleges of further education.</i>
degree	Social or official rank. <i>The lowered third degree of the scale.</i>
deserved	Properly deserved. <i>A deserved standing ovation.</i>
diploma	A document certifying the successful completion of a course of study.
dissertation	A long essay on a particular subject, especially one written for a university degree or diploma. <i>A dissertation on the novels of the Bront sisters.</i>
doctoral	Of or relating to a doctor or doctorate. <i>A doctoral thesis.</i>
doctorate	One of the highest earned academic degrees conferred by a university. <i>A doctorate in art history.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>Through the years she has earned affection and esteem.</i>

gain	Increase in value. <i>She gained 20 pounds when she stopped exercising.</i>
income	Money received, especially on a regular basis, for work or through investments. <i>Figures showed an overall increase in income this year.</i>
inheritance	Hereditary succession to a title or an office or property. <i>My only inheritance was my mother's blessing.</i>
legalization	The act of making lawful. <i>Calls for the legalization of cannabis.</i>
merited	Properly deserved. <i>A merited success.</i>
musicology	The study of music as an academic subject, as distinct from training in performance or composition; scholarly research into music.
overpayment	A payment larger than needed or expected. <i>He received 20 000 in benefit overpayments.</i>
phd	A doctorate usually based on at least 3 years graduate study and a dissertation; the highest degree awarded graduate study.
procure	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. <i>He haunted railway stations to procure young girls for immoral purposes.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>The president was concerned about the property across from the White House.</i>
recognition	Acknowledgement of the existence, validity, or legality of something. <i>Territorial disputes were resolved in Guatemala's recognition of Belize in 1991.</i>
riches	Valuable or abundant resources. <i>Riches beyond their wildest dreams.</i>
scholarship	Academic study or achievement; learning at a high level. <i>He went on a state sponsored scholarship to study engineering.</i>
stipend	A sum of money allotted on a regular basis; usually for some specific purpose.
thesis	An unproved statement put forward as a premise in an argument. <i>A doctoral thesis.</i>
trait	A distinguishing feature of your personal nature. <i>The traditionally British trait of self denigration.</i>
vat	Place or treat in a vat. <i>A vat of hot tar.</i>
